Physical Education is enriched through LSSP and the LFC Foundation, providing high-quality coaching and opportunities to develop teamwork, resilience and leadership.

Modern Foreign Languages – Spanish is delivered by SIL alongside Miss Elba, broadening cultural awareness and communication skills.

These partnerships ensure our pupils experience high-quality teaching from specialists while nurturing talents and interests that extend beyond the classroom.




नमस्कार (Namaskār) – more formal




Parents' Evening will be coming up at the end of the half term. On Wednesday 25th March we will finish at 2.30pm for appointments to begin at 2.45pm.


