Forest School:

Year 4 will take part in Forest School each Monday after half term. Please can you ensure that your child has a pair of wellies to keep in school until Easter. Thank you.

Reminders:

Uniform and Appearance (See Appendix C in the School Prospectus for full uniform list):

Jewellery including smart phone watches must not be worn at school It is important that ear-piercing is **ONLY** carried out in the summer holidays as earrings are **not** permitted to be worn at school. Equally, children are not allowed to wear make-up of any sort to school and nail varnish must be removed. The school encourages pupils to have a smart overall appearance.

Hair must be left its natural colour and severe haircuts are not allowed, no tram lines please. Long hair is to be tied back and hair ornaments are not considered uniform, e.g. large clips, large bows, ornamental headbands, etc. and children will be asked to remove them. **No** number 1 or number 2 haircuts are permitted! No trainers, black school shoes only. Thank you.

Car Park and Parking:

- The one-way system must be adhered to.
- Only park in the designated parking bays.
- The disabled bays are only to be used by registered disabled badge holders. The badge **MUST** be on view.
- No parking on designated walk ways or **yellow gridded areas**.
- Supervise your child when using the car park.
- Engines to be switched off once you have parked in the car park.
- Do not park inconsiderately across local driveways.
- Fixed Penalty Charge Notices will be issued to anybody parking on the zigzags- it's dangerous and illegal.

Fr Michael allows the school to have use of the car park; the car park does not belong to school. A log is kept and shared with the police of any near misses, abusive behaviour on the car park, dangerous/inconsiderate parking.

Thank you for your co-operation in keeping every child safe. Please share the above with whoever picks your child up from school so everyone is clear about car parking at the end of the school day.

Admin Reminders:

- A week's notice **must** be given in writing (preferably by email) if you wish your child to change from packed lunches to school meals, or vice-versa. This is normal school policy – thank you for your co-operation.
- **It is essential that your child's Parent Pay account is in credit for school meals and Early Bird's. Please may I remind you to check your child's Parent Pay account on a regular basis and top-up as necessary. The account MUST stay in credit at all times.** Thank you for your co-operation.
- Check your child's bag on a regular basis to make sure you are not missing out on anything. Any letters issued are also put on the school website.

And finally....

If any parents or grandparents has some available time, we are looking for volunteers to help us on school trips, walks etc. School trips provide an opportunity for children to learn outside the classroom and we do need a few more helpers in order for these trips to continue. If anyone is interested, please contact the school office for further information. An enhanced DBS will need to be done prior to any trips which school will be able to provide.
