Our halls were ringing with more than just silver bells this week! We are incredibly proud of all the students who took part in our annual Christmas Concert, we had 38 students attending! It was a spectacular showcase of talent, ranging from classical Christmas songs and carols to high-energy rock!

The afternoon was a true journey through different musical styles. Our audience was treated to solo performances on the glockenspiel and hand bells, solo singing performances and a group performance in the rock band! We would like to especially thank Tim and the Lancashire music service for providing the tuition and musical instruments so that the students were able to perform as part of a rock band.

While the music was fantastic, the real highlight was seeing the confidence of our performers. Whether it was their first time on stage or they are seasoned veterans, their sense of fun and pride shone through in every note. It is a testament to their hard work and dedication throughout the term.

A massive thank you to all the parents, guardians and family members who attended. Your cheers, applause and ongoing support make these performances possible. We hope the show left you feeling festive and proud!









We have had a fantastic half-term in Spruce and have fully embraced our Traditional Tale topic. The children have been captivated by our Cinderella sensory story and absolutely loved retelling 'The Three Little Pigs' using props and role play. They have been developing brilliant speaking and listening skills while stepping into the roles of different characters. Later in the term, we enjoyed getting festive with Christmas stories such as 'Stick Man' and 'The Snowman'. The children particularly enjoyed comparing the settings and discussing how the characters were feeling.

In Maths, we have been very busy developing our addition skills. We have been recognising and forming numbers correctly, representing quantities with objects and pictures, exploring doubles and using number lines and hundred squares to support our learning. The children are growing in confidence when adding numbers up to 20 and are becoming more independent in choosing the resources they need to help them.

In PSHE, we have been learning about the way we grow and change — from a tiny baby through to adulthood and later life. We had great fun with our baby photo quiz! The children were so excited to guess which baby was who, and the drum-roll reveals created lots of smiles and laughter.

In History, our focus has been on buildings and the different types of homes we live in. The children enjoyed exploring photographs of their own houses and comparing them to buildings in the past. We also talked about the materials used to build homes and which ones are the most suitable.

The children have also thoroughly enjoyed outdoor learning, making the most of our school grounds. They have been exploring nature, developing teamwork skills and using the environment to support learning in all subjects — especially during our traditional tale adventures outside!

We are incredibly proud of all the hard work and enthusiasm the children have shown this term.

Walnut have had a great term. We have done some exciting things which the pupils have really enjoyed. We have been on the bus, learning how to pay for tickets and keep our tickets safe. We have been in a variety of cafes and shops. In Maths we have been learning about measure, finding out who was the tallest and shortest in the class and in English our story has been 'The Grinch' and how he tried to steal Christmas. We have also taken part in employability skills that have included planting trees, washing cars and picking up leaves.













This half term, our topic in Birch Class has been "I Can Make."

In our English and Communication lessons, we have been learning all about parties—building up to planning and hosting our very own Christmas celebration. Pupils have been developing their communication and listening skills through activities such as making party invitations, hats, decorations and cakes. We have also enjoyed sharing the story 'Peppa Pig's Party Bus' and answering "W" questions (who, what, where, what doing), using colourful semantics to support sentence building.

We have continued with our weekly Attention Autism sessions and sensory exploration activities, with a strong focus on phonics, reading and writing skills.

Our weekly communication sessions have linked to "I Can Make Friends". The children have loved engaging with one another through music, movement and shared activities, and we have seen fantastic progress from everyone.

In maths, we explored time, including daily routines, days of the week and months of the year, before moving on to number work.

In RE, we created bonfire crafts and remembrance artwork. We then learned about Hanukkah, making our own clay dreidels, menorahs and even potato latkes.

In Geography, we have been discovering how different items are made around the world.

The pupils have tried making hobby horses, pizzas, lava lamps and Kokeshi dolls. In PSHE, our focus has been healthy eating. Everyone has done brilliantly during our food desensitisation sessions and we have explored a wide variety of healthy foods together. In PE, we have enjoyed playing the Colour Stations game and developing turn-taking skills through curling.

In Music, we have been busy making music and exploring a range of instruments - experimenting with different ways to play them and reacting to changes in tempo during dance massage activities.

Finally, in Science, we have been learning all about recycling, taking part in lots of hands-on, practical activities.







We've had a super busy half term in Alder! Our topic "I Can Make" let us build towers, make fruit salad, paint pictures and play instruments. In phonics, our hungry Phonics Monster gobbled up items beginning with our sound of the week! Our Christmas sensory story was full of magic - snow patterns, drawing fairy lights and festive role play.

In maths, we explored prepositions like on, under, and next to, and went on a fun Elf Hunt to spot numbers.

In PSHE, we learned about good and bad touch, body parts and using STOP to stay safe.

We celebrated Hanukkah, planted trees outdoors and made nature art.

In swimming, we grew more confident through games and in science, we discovered recycling by making bowls, drums and decorations.

Finally, in music, we explored quiet and loud and followed visual cues like pros! We finished the term with a trip to the cinema and lots of festive fun!

Wow – what a busy and brilliant half term Willow Class has had! We've been travelling all the way to Spain, exploring its culture, food, art and stories – and we've had so much fun along the way.

We've dived into a range of fiction and non-fiction texts, including 'The Story of Ferdinand', The Cazuela that the Farm Maiden Stirred', and even a Spanish Christmas story. The children have been amazing at exploring new ideas, practising their reading skills and sharing their thoughts about Spanish life and traditions.

Our Spanish learning didn't stop at stories! In Art and DT, the children have been busy creating, designing and tasting. They explored Spanish cuisines, planning, preparing and evaluating their own dishes. We also delved into the colourful world of Antoni Gaudí, learning about his love for natural materials, curved lines and the mosaic technique called trencadís. The children's creations were simply fantastic and we now have a beautiful Spanish display celebrating their hard work!

This term, we've been ticking along with time, learning to read analogue and digital clocks, understand routines and compare differences between days. We've also been sharpening our addition and subtraction skills, practising simple calculations with growing confidence. In Science, our focus has been on everyday materials and their uses. The children have been exploring different materials, discovering their properties and taking part in exciting material hunts around the school and classroom.

PE has been full of movement and music! We've explored dance, enjoyed Spanish freeze dances, experimented with different body actions and created our own dance routines, linking movements and adapting them to music. It's been energetic and fun.

Finally, a huge thank you to everyone who came to the Christmas disco – the children had a fantastic time and it was lovely to see you all enjoying the festivities.

We hope everybody has a lovely Christmas 😃







