Elizabeth I (1533-1603) was the Queen of England and Ireland from 17th November 1558 until her death on 24th March 1603.

She is one of the most **famous queens** that Britain has ever had. She was the **youngest daughter of Henry VIII**. Her mother was Anne Boleyn.

The time at which Elizabeth reigned is called the **Elizabethan era**.

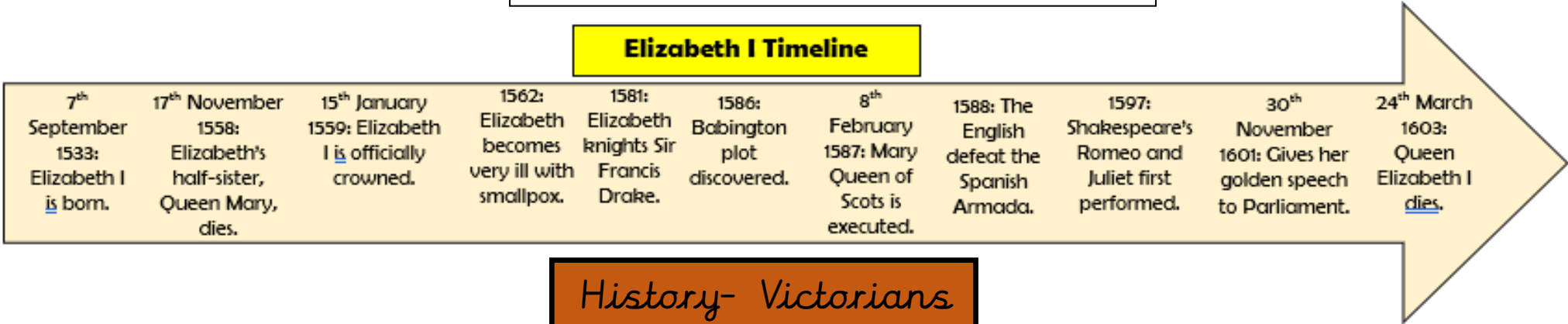

What was a Workhouse?

A workhouse was a huge building built for very poor people to live and work. They were poor for a number of reasons: ill health, old age, single mothers, orphaned children or purely because they couldn't find work.

Able-bodied, unemployed people had no choice but to enter a workhouse. The alternative was prison!
