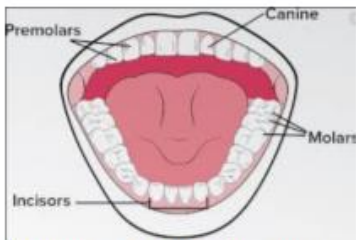


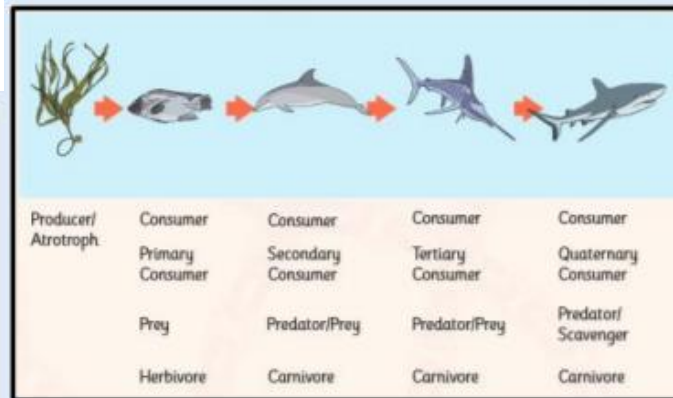
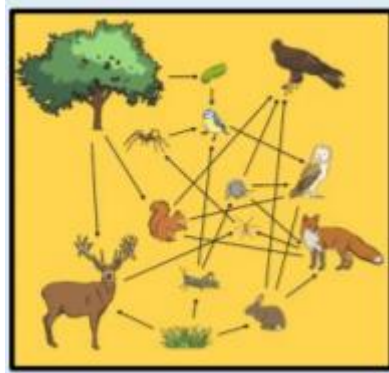

Vocabulary		
Food chain A series of organisms interrelated in their feeding habits.	Producer Food chains start with a producer - usually a green plant or algae.	Consumer Consumers get their food by eating plants or other animals.
Predator An animal that hunts and eats other animals.	Prey Animals that are eaten by other animals.	
Digest Break down food so that it can be used by the body	Glands Organs that release fluids to be used by the body.	Enzymes Special molecules in the body that cause chemical reactions
Oesophagus A muscular tube which forms the path from the mouth to the stomach.	Small intestine Absorbs nutrients from food.	Large intestine Absorbs water from waste food and forms stools from the waste food.
Incisors Teeth that are used for biting and cutting food.	Canines Teeth that are used for tearing and ripping food.	Premolars Teeth that are used to hold and crush food.
Molars Teeth that are used to grind food.	Wisdom teeth Third set of molar teeth that are no longer required by humans.	Tooth decay The breakdown of teeth caused by acids made by bacteria.



- **Canines** are pointed for tearing and ripping food - these are usually used when chewing meat.
- **Incisors** are shovel shaped and help bite lumps out of and cutting food.
- **Premolars** and **molars** are flat and they grind and crush food.
