### Personal, Social and Emotional Development

- Express own feelings and consider the feelings of others.
- Identify and moderate their own feelings, encourage children to understand when they feel happy, sad, angry, surprised etc
- · Understand how to be safe around fireworks

#### Maths

- Compare groups of 1, 2 or 3 objects
- Circles and Triangles recognise these shapes in everyday objects and the environment around us, describe some properties of circles and triangles.
- Spatial Awareness begin to use positional language e.g.: next to, on, under, above. Begin to represent positional language in maps, models and drawings.
- Recognise a set of 4 objects by counting or subitising – identify different representations of 4, e.g.: with cubes, Numicon, 5 frame, numeral. Use own mark making to represent 4.

### Understanding the World

- Explore lives of 'people who help us' e.g.: postal worker, doctor, teacher, dentist etc.
- Explore a heroic figure from recent history/local community and tell their story.
  - Understand the past through settings, characters and events encountered in books read in class and storytelling.

### Physical Development

- Practice moving in different ways like a superhero e.g.: running, jumping, dancing, hopping, skipping and climbing.
- Use tools safely and effectively to make a vegetable soup.
- Participate in fine motor skill activities to strengthen muscles in hands and develop movements to aid fluency and accuracy with mark making.

# My Heroes

### Expressive Arts and Design

- · Develop storylines in their pretend play.
- Create own superhero vegetable using printing and collage materials.
- Create superhero dens and role play narratives based on real life superheroes.
- Learn an Autumn poem & song to perform in front of the Nursery children as part of the School's Harvest Festival celebrations.

### Communication and Language

- Ask questions to find out more (during visits from nurse and community police) and to check they understand what has been said to them.
- Listen to and talk about selected non-fiction books to develop a deep familiarity with new knowledge and vocabulary.
- Listen to and talk about stories to build familiarity and understanding.

### Writing

- Orally plan a sentence before either adult scribes or child attempts to spell words by identifying sounds and writing letters.
- Write correct initial sounds of words.
- Start to write CVC (consonant, vowel, consonant) words eg. cat, mat.

### Reading

- Reading the following key texts as a class:
  People Who Help Us Non-Fiction Series,
  Supertato by Sue Hendra and Paul Linnet,
  Juniper Jupiter by Lizzie Stewart.
- Read individual letters by saying the sounds for them.
- · Participating in phonics sessions.
