WHAT I WILL KNOW	VOCABULARY
Describe Christian beliefs about sin and forgiveness.	Truth A fact or a belief that is accepted as true.
Describe and explain the teaching from Genesis 3 – of how Adam and Eve disobeyed God.	Forgiveness The action or process of forgiving or being forgiven.
Suggest different ways that this story might be understood by Christians.	Consequences A result of a particular action or situation.
Describe and explain how and why Christians might use the Lord's prayer.	Temptation A desire to do something, especially something wrong or unwise.
Analyse and interpret the Lord's prayer – and what guidance it provides for Christians.	Values Principles or standards of behaviour; one's judgement of what is important in life.
Suggest things that might lead Christians into temptation in the modern world – and how and why they might try to resist these temptations.	Moral Adjective – concerned with the principles of right or wrong behaviour Noun – A lesson that can be derived from a story or experience.
Consider the different ways that myth and stories are and used.	Myths A widely held but false belief or idea; a misinterpretation of the truth.
Explain how a 'truth' might be contained within a story.	Metaphorical Characteristic of or relating to metaphor; figurative.
Consider how they decide what is 'true' – and how there might be different types of truths.	Parable/Genesis A simple story used to illustrate a moral or spiritual lesson.
Discuss and debate things that they consider to be true that others might disagree with.	Lord's Prayer
