

Academy meals, that are provided, teach children about healthy eating, and the cafeteria system contributes to their social education. We are very fortunate at Greenhill in the range and quality of the food provided by our kitchen staff. Halal food is cooked on the premises, and a wide variety is available.

Children not requiring our meals may bring their own packed lunches, which may be eaten in the dining hall. Packed lunches should be brought to school with the child by 9am and be stored on the rack in the dining hall. Children are required to remain on academy premises.

Home learning Expectations

- Home learning is extremely important.
- The children in Year 5 have had a disrupted Year 2 and Year 3 and the children in Year 6 have had a disrupted Year 3 and Year 4. As we are aware, because of the disruptions, the children have missed out on vital education and home learning is something that is very important to close any learning gaps! Every child in KS2 has been given an iPad so they can access their learning at home.
- Please support us with this. Home learning will be set by the class teacher weekly. This may be in the form of Purple Mash, TT Rock Stars, MyOn or being set as a project.
- Please also read with your child for at least 10 minutes a day. They will take home a school library book, that is based on their Accelerated Reader age, daily and can also access their MyON log in to read a book online.
