Our topic in Spring is...

During the holidays, why not...


- ...research what *food and drink* is associated with Argentinian culture?

Writing

Our writing work will mainly focus on South America, especially the *Amazon rainforest*, which some of the children might remember from their time in Year 4. We'll be looking at the book *Secrets of the Rainforest* to help us remember about the layers of the rainforest, the different animals that live there and what it would be like if you ended up there yourself!





Maths

There's lots more for us to cover in January, including

- Capacity
- Angles and constructing 2D shapes
- Time and timetables
- Length and perimeter

The children can use their iPads to practise their maths work on *Sumdog* as much as they like, or use *Times Tables Rock Stars* to practise their times tables. Will their class win the times table trophy? Will any of our Y6 children be the Northmoor times table champion?
