This half term, our PSHE learning will focus on **rules and responsibilities**. The children will revisit our academy rules and classroom expectations, helping to create class charters and discussing how we can show respect and kindness towards one another. They will also learn about the importance of having a voice within the academy community by taking part in the election of the Children's Leadership Team and by taking on a range of responsibilities across the academy. This will help them develop a sense of belonging, leadership and responsibility.

Ground Rules

Provide a safe learning space, with consistent ground rules

Must include not asking personal questions or sharing personal information

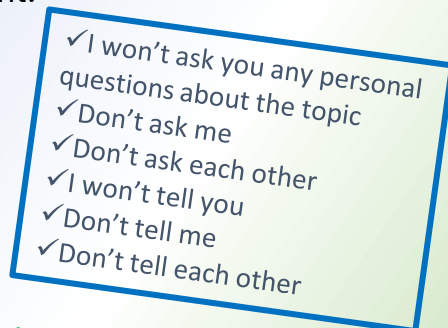
Use correct terminology – this avoids derogatory use of language

Establish ground rules that are consistent across year groups

Confidentiality (unless safeguarding)

Right to pass (as long as actively listening)

This half term, children will learn and follow the PSHE ground rules that help create a safe and respectful learning environment.

Trusted Adults

This half term, children will learn about **trusted adults** and why it is important to have people they can turn to for help, support and advice. Together, we will discuss who their trusted adults might be at school, at home and within the wider community.

We encourage families to continue these conversations at home so that children are confident in identifying the trusted adults they can speak to if they ever need help.
