

Water Bottles

Most children had a bottle in school but we did have a few issues with some that were not named. Your body is made up of about two thirds water so it is hardly surprising that an inadequate fluid intake throughout the day can lead to dehydration. Effects of dehydration include: reduced concentration levels, increased irritability, loss of appetite, headaches, reduced energy. Regular water intake is a great habit to get into both at school and home.

Uniform

It is important we have the correct uniform in school. Stud earrings are allowed but any pupils will be asked to remove any other jewellery for safety reasons. Long hair should be tied back (especially on PE days).
