| 1 | There are many different types of <br> materials e.g. wood, plastic, glass, <br> fabric, metal etc. |
| 2 | Materials have different properties <br> and can be described in different <br> ways e.g. bendy, transparent, hard, <br> soft etc. |
| 3 | Objects made from the same <br> material can be grouped together in <br> different ways. |
| 4 | Some materials are natural and <br> others are manmade. |
| 5 | Materials are chosen to suit a <br> particular purpose e.g. glass is used <br> for windows as it is transparent. |

| 1 | Object | A thing that can be <br> used. For example a <br> door, chair, car, table <br> are all objects. |
| 2 | Material | Materials are what an <br> object is made from. |
| 3 | Absorbent | If something is <br> absorbent, it soaks water <br> up. |
| 4 | Transparent | Transparent objects can <br> be seen through. |
| 5 | Opaque | Opaque objects can't <br> be seen through. |
