## Key ideas to retain

-Christianity is based on the teachings of Jesus Christ who lived 2,000 years ago.
-The Holy Communion is a celebration where Christians remember Christ's sacrifice.
-Different types of Christians worship in different ways and singing is an important part of many Church services.
-Christian churches hold services of worship every Sunday. Other events happen at churches throughout the week such as bible studies and prayer nights.
-Christians go to church to praise God together as a group, and to build friendships with other Christians and learn from the Bible together.


## Key Vocabulary

Christian - people who follow the teachings of Jesus Christ.

Jesus Christ - the Son of God.

Church - the Christian place of worship.

Holy Communion - a ritual to show the togetherness of Christians and God.

Worship - The act of showing love and devotion to God.

Service - where Christians gather together in church to be taught the 'Word of God'.

Holy Bible - God's word.

Civil rights activist - someone who stands up for equal rights regardless of skin colour, gender, nationality, religion, disability or age.
