<b>The 1950s</b>	A decade that began on January 1, 1950, and ended on December 31, 1959.
<b>The 1960s</b>	A decade that began on January 1, 1960, and ended on December 31, 1969.
<b>20<sup>th</sup> Century</b>	The period between January 1, 1901 and December 31, 1999.
<b>Decade</b>	a period of ten years.
<b>Century</b>	A period of 100 years
<b>Timeline</b>	A line of events to show the order in which they happened.
<b>Chronological</b>	A list of events in time order
<b>Fashion</b>	A style of clothing, hair or decoration.
<b>Rock and Roll</b>	A type of popular dance music that started in the 1950s.
<b>Coronation</b>	The ceremony of crowning a king or queen.
<b>Invention</b>	A new thing that someone has made.
