

Focus:

Art - Horizon, perspective and composition

Key facts to retain (must know):

Maria Iliou is a Greek artist with autism spectrum condition. Her subject matter varies from abstract to scenes of nature and family life.

Michael Monaco is an artist and painter. His artwork showcases stunning colours and technique. He solely paints using his mouth to hold the brush and has had many exhibitions around the world.

Richard Wawro was a Scottish artist notable for his landscapes in wax oil crayon.

Perspective drawing brings two dimensional drawings and paintings to life. Perspective drawings make 2D objects appear three dimensional.

The horizon line represents where the sky meets the land or sea in a picture. This line is important to remember as the vanishing point will often sit on the horizon line.

Key terms:

Background—the part of a painting representing what lies behind objects

Composition—the term given to a complete work of art and, more specifically, to the way in which all its elements work together to produce an overall

Foreground—the picture space nearest to the viewer, immediately behind the picture plane

Horizon line— boundary where sky separates from land or water.

Landscapes—a picture depicting scenery on land

Perspective— representing objects in three-dimensional space on the two-dimensional surface of a picture

Vanishing point— the point in fictive space which is supposed to appear the furthest from the viewer.
