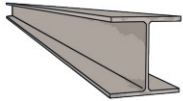

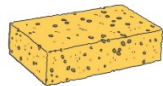

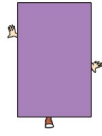

Material

A **material** is what something is **made of**, such as wood or plastic.

Object

An **object** is a thing that can **be used, touched or seen**. Doors, cars, chairs and marbles are examples of **objects**.

Properties

The **properties** of a material tell us **what it is like** and **how it behaves**, such as whether it is soft, rough or transparent.

There are lots of different types of **materials** and their different **properties** make them useful for different **objects**.

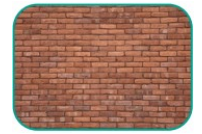
