English	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>The Blue Umbrella</b></p> <p><i>In this writing unit, children will learn to write a narrative and children will practice using direct speech.</i></p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>Bill's new Frock</b></p> <p><i>Through this story, children will build upon their fluency and comprehension skills.</i></p>
Mathematics	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Maths Year 3</b></p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>Multiplication and Division</b></p> <p><i>Multiplication and division facts for 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 8 and 10. Multiplicative structures: equal groups/parts, change and comparison, correspondence problems. Relationships: commutativity and inverse.</i></p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>Length and perimeter</b></p> <p><i>Children will learn how to measure in mm, cm and m, add and subtract length, measure and calculate perimeter.</i></p>
Science	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Rocks and soils</b></p> <p><i>In this unit, children will learn about the different types of rocks and how they are formed, as well as their uses in everyday life. They will also explore soils, investigating how soils are made, their different properties, and how they support plants and living things.</i></p>
History	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Why did the Romans invade and settle in Britain?</b></p> <p><i>Children will learn why the Romans chose to invade Britain and how this invasion changed life in Britain. They will explore key aspects of Roman rule, including the Roman army, settlements, roads and daily life, and understand the lasting impact the Romans had on Britain.</i></p>
PE	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Y3</b></p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>Basketball</b></p> <p><i>In this unit, children will focus skills such as dribbling and gaining and maintaining possession. They will build up to a tournament in the final lesson.</i></p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>Gymnastics</b></p> <p><i>In this unit, children will focus skills such as balancing, jumping, rolling and will create sequences in the final weeks.</i></p>
Computing	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Branching databases</b></p> <p><i>In this unit, children will learn how to use branching databases to organise, sort and identify information. They will develop their questioning and logical thinking skills by creating and using yes/no questions to classify objects and make decisions..</i></p>
RE	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Divali</b></p> <p><i>In this unit children will be studying the Hindu festival of light.</i></p>
Music	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Recorders</b></p> <p><i>In the unit, children will learn to play the recorder with increasing confidence, developing accurate finger placement, breathing and control. They will explore the Enchanting Forest piece, learning to read simple notation, play in time and perform as part of a group</i></p>
PSHE	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Safety and the changing body</b></p> <p><i>In this unit Children will learn how to keep themselves safe in a range of situations, including online, at home and in the wider world. They will also explore how their bodies change as they</i></p>
