ATTENDANCE MATTERS

Regular attendance is vital for your child's academic success, confidence, and friendships. Aiming for 100% attendance helps children build essential life habits, while missing school disrupts learning.

The school doors open at 8.45am and close at 8.55am when the register is taken. Arriving late disrupts the start of their day, meaning they will miss vital learning in Maths and English.

If your child is too ill, and really can't attend school, please report this via school spider as soon as possible. Even if one child is poorly, it is vitally important that siblings still come to school on time.

Mrs Pickford works closely with our Educational Welfare Officer to identify families who are persistently absent or late to school and offer support to improve each child's percentage attendance.

MEET FATIMA...

Fatima goes to school 90% of the time. Her parents think this is good. But:

- Fatima misses half a day of school every week;
- Over a year, she misses 4 full weeks of lessons;
- Over her school career, she could miss 209 days – more than a full year of school.

Even though 90% sounds okay, Fatima is spending more time out of school than in it. This is called **persistent absence**.
