

<p>English</p> <p>Writing Our key text for this half term is 'Hello Lighthouse' by Sophie Blackall. We will also work on extending sentences to make them more descriptive and informative by using prepositional phrases, similes and personification. They will work towards creating a four-part story based on the changes experienced across a year - an idea introduced in the book. They will also have the opportunity to write a diary entry as if they were a character in the book.</p> <p></p>	<p></p> <p>Spring 1 2026 Year 3 & 4</p> <p><i>'With God all things are possible'</i> Matthew 19:26</p> <p><i>It is this belief in us from God that will enable us to dream, believe and achieve</i></p>	<p>Maths Year 3 will be looking at 3-digit numbers and what each column is worth. They will move onto partitioning numbers, using both standard and non-standard methods. They will practise counting in 50s, before spending time revising and developing what they know about comparing and ordering numbers. Year 4 are looking at 4-digit numbers and different ways in which they can be partitioned so not always breaking the number into thousands, hundreds, tens and ones but looking at what other ways it could be split up. They will move on to rounding numbers</p>
<p>Topic Our next project week is called 'The gift of the Nile' studying rivers, the water cycle and then finishing the week with pop up books. This is a Geography and DT focus. We will be looking at different sources of light and determine if they are natural or artificial.
