

We are working with the Maths Hub this year and really focusing on building children’s confidence and mathematical fluency. We are supporting the children to develop secure number sense, subitising skills, and understanding composition to make sure that all pupils can calculate accurately and efficiently.

What is subitising and how can you help at home?



Subitising is the ability to instantly recognise the number of items in a group without counting them individually and it helps children of any age and ability. To help your child, use quick, visual games with small quantities (up to 5) such as dice, dominoes, and cards, or by briefly showing and hiding objects.

This week's topic- Building secure relationships with children
Secure relationships are the foundation of a child's emotional wellbeing. From birth, children rely on the adults around them to meet their physical and emotional needs. When caregivers respond with warmth, attention and consistency, children learn that the world is safe and that adults can be trusted. This helps them feel soothed, secure, and confident to explore and learn.

This week's Parenting Smart tip looks at simple ways to strengthen your relationship with your child. It explores how everyday moments like listening closely, offering comfort, and being emotionally available help build a strong bond. It also explains how predictable routines, clear boundaries, and staying calm during tricky moments support children to feel safe. Over time, these small, consistent interactions help children develop resilience, independence, and a secure sense of themselves.
