

A week in pictures...





This week's topic- My child might be getting bullied. What can I do? Bullying can be deeply upsetting for both children and the adults who care for them. It can include behaviours such as hitting, threatening, unkind teasing, or deliberately leaving someone out. It's also important to recognise the difference between normal friendship fallouts and bullying. Friendships naturally involve disagreements or occasional unkind moments, but bullying is intentional, repeated, and involves a power imbalance. Understanding this distinction can help you respond calmly and appropriately.

This Parenting Smart tip explores ways to support your child if you're worried they may be experiencing bullying. It looks at how to listen and understand what they're telling you, help them make sense of what bullying means, and support them to feel more in control. It also offers ideas for managing your own feelings, so you can respond in a way that helps your child feel safe and heard.

Working together with school or other trusted adults can also make a big difference.
