Starting a new term can feel exciting but also challenging for children. Be patient as they settle back into routines and support them with any worries or changes.

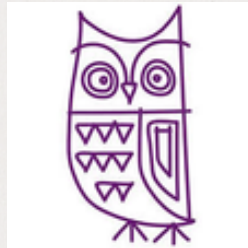

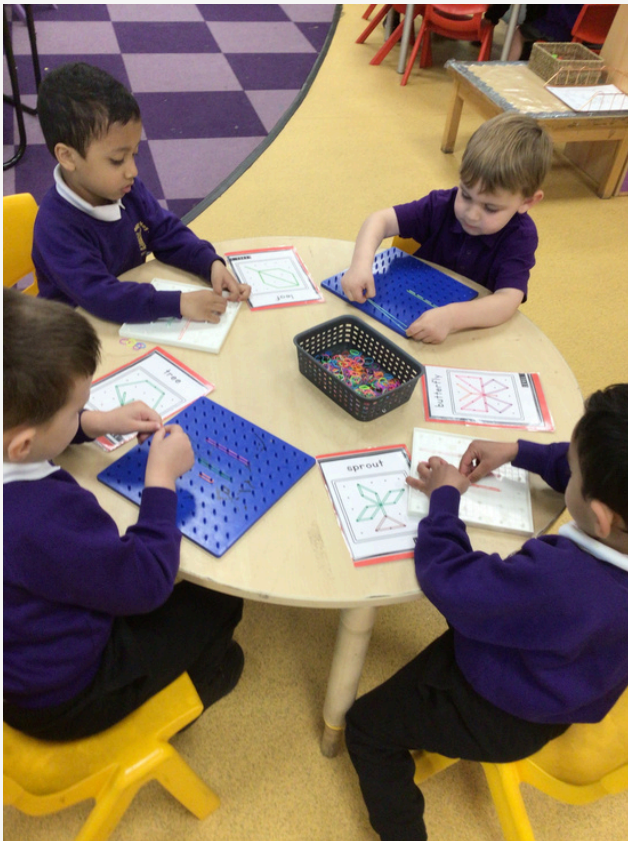

A week in pictures...







Parenting Smart is Place2Be's website full of practical advice and tried and tested tips for parents and carers of primary age children.

This week's topic: My child is feeling sad or low

Children's moods naturally rise and fall, and it is normal for them to feel sad at times. When sadness lasts longer, it can be worrying for parents. With gentle support, children can learn to understand their feelings and feel more able to cope.

This Parenting Smart tip explains why children may find it hard to talk about sadness and offers simple ways to help them open up. It encourages noticing changes in behaviour, helping children name their feelings, and using drawing or play if talking feels difficult. It also highlights that children may not always know why they feel sad, and that events such as a bereavement or changes at home can affect their mood even if they do not mention it.

The article also reminds parents that it is okay for children to feel sad and that adults staying calm can help children feel more secure. Giving children time and space to express sadness, without rushing to fix it, can help them feel understood and supported.
