Easter Holidays are a great time for children to rest and enjoy play. Encourage outdoor activities, creative crafts or family games to support wellbeing and family connections.

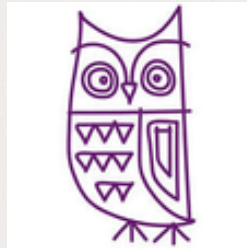


Nurture Principles - tip of the week

Parenting Smart- Is Place2Be's website full of practical advice and tried and tested tips for parents and carers of primary-age children. This week's topic- My child is worried about the news Children hear about the news in many different ways – on TV, at school, or online. It's completely normal for them to feel worried about things they see or hear. With your support, they can learn to understand what's happening and manage their feelings. This Parenting Smart tip explores why news stories can feel overwhelming for children and offers simple, supportive ways to help them cope. It highlights the importance of being open to conversations, letting your child lead with their questions, and helping them express their feelings, whether through talking or play. The article also explains how looking for facts together, discussing reliable sources, and understanding that news often focuses on dramatic events can help children feel more reassured. It also suggests noticing the "helpers" in difficult situations, accepting that sometimes we don't have all the answers, and supporting children to manage uncertainty. Over time, these small, consistent steps can help children feel safer, more informed, and more confident when they encounter worrying news.
