

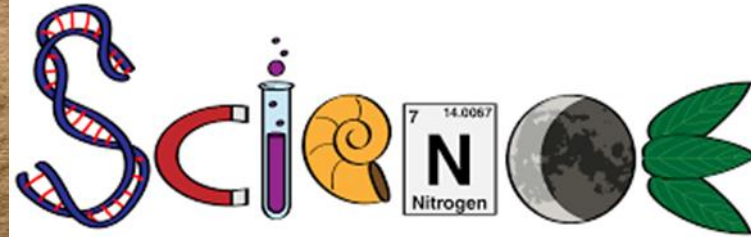


ROCKS AND ROLL – CLASS 3

KNOWLEDGE ORGANISER



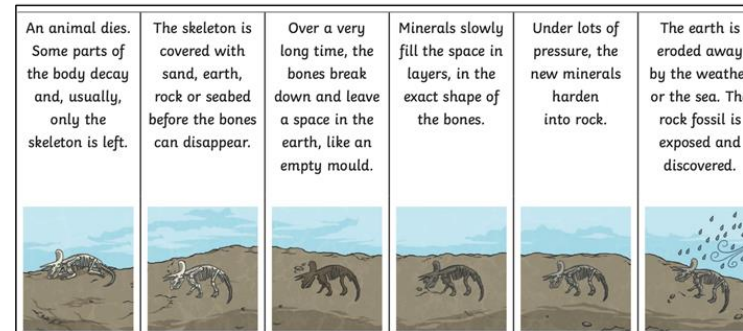
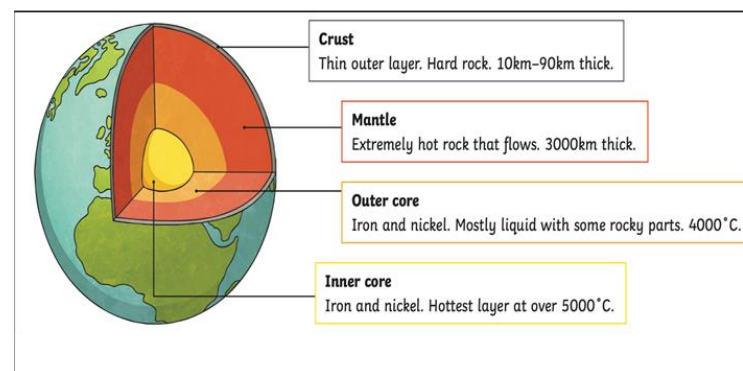

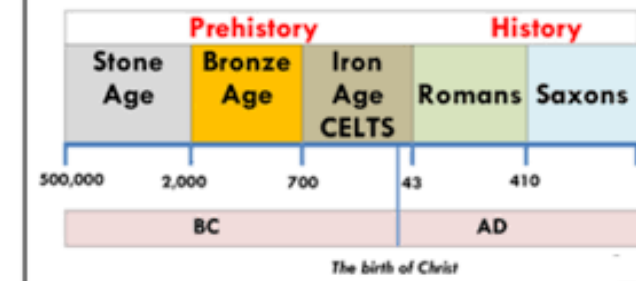
Key vocabulary and definitions

- **see**
Perceive with the eyes.
- **light**
The natural agent that makes things visible.
- **torch**
A portable lamp.
- **shadow**
A dark area or shape produced by a body coming between rays of light and a surface.
- **Reflection**
The throwing back by a body or surface of light.
- **Reflective**
Capable of reflecting light.
- **Mirror**
A surface, typically made of glass, which reflects a clear image.

- Volcanoes are made when pressure builds up inside the earth. This affects the earth's crust causing **magma** to sometimes **erupt** through it.
- Active volcanoes have **erupted** in the last 10 000 years.
- Dormant volcanoes haven't **erupted** in the last 10 000 years but may erupt again.
- Extinct volcanoes aren't expected to **erupt** again.
