### Year R Autumn 2 2025-2026 -



Each half term your child's learning will be linked to a topic. This half term the topic is 'Festivals and Celebrations'. The curriculum map is divided up into the 7 areas of learning in EYFS and R.E. It informs you what your child will be learning over the half term.

#### **Communication and Language**

We will be practising our listening skills and learning to take turns when playing games.

# Personal, Social and Emotional Development

We will use circle time to promote our class expectations and reflect on our friendships. We will be creating a friendship tree and discovering what makes a good friend.

#### **Physical Development**

We will be continuing activities to improve both fine and gross motor skills. We will be playing chasing and dodging games. We will be travelling using both our hands and our feet across obstacle courses. We will continue to make healthy food choices. We are still practising to become independent when fastening our coats.

#### Literacy

This half term we will be sharing the story of Chapatti Moon, looking at instructions to make chapattis and reading The Christmas Story. We will be practising our phonics and writing skills.

#### Mathematics

This term, we will learn about numbers 4 and 5, exploring how to recognise, represent, add one more, take one away, and make numbers in different ways. We will also explore shapes, their positions, and day and night

#### Understanding the World

We will be learning about our environment this half term. We will be observing how the season changes.

#### **Expressive Arts and Design**

We will be creating our faces using natural autumn materials. We will be learning new songs with the focus on Christmas ready for our Christmas performance. We will be practising our cutting and joining skills when making cards.

#### Religious Education

The focus in R.E. this half term is Christmas. We will be thinking about the meaning of Christmas. We will be reading the Christmas story and acting out the Nativity.
