#### This Half-term

- This half term, our topic has been 'Journeys and Transport'. We have had lots of exciting things going on, including a trip on the tram, a visit from the Highways Agency and their snow truck and of course our visit to Manchester Airport Run way Visitor Park! The children were amazing on each of our visits and we are so very proud of them!
- Our focus texts this half term have been 'The Journey Home from Grandpa's' and 'Whatever Next'. The children have learnt these texts inside out and completed some incredible writing based on them! We also learnt about the artist, Andy Warhol and made our own pop-art with cars!
- In maths, we have been consolidating our knowledge of numbers to 6 and learning about size, height, length, weight and capacity!
- We set up a train station in our role play area and the children have loved using their imaginations to go on different journeys around the world!
- We have loved learning about spring! We have had some lovely weather which has enabled us to start to recognise the signs of spring during our spring walk and of course, enable lots of incredible outdoor learning opportunities! We invited our grown ups into Nursery to paint a spring flower and have made a beautiful display with everyone's artwork! And of course we planted our own cress seeds and watched them grow!

#### This Half-term:

- Our topic this half term has been 'Journey's & Transport'. We have explored a wide range of vehicles including those involved in space travel through our Literacy texts 'Naughty Bus' by Jan Oke and 'How to catch a star' by Oliver Jeffers. The children have created amazing story maps and books inspired by these stories.
- This half term we had a wonderful time on our Reception trip to the Airport Runway Visitors Park. The children were able to observe the airplanes take off and land from the viewing platform and participated in tours of various airplanes. We had lots of opportunities to ask questions and role play as different cabin crew/ people who work at the airport. Our budding pilots also had the opportunity to use the control panel to 'fly' a plane in the flight deck. What an amazing day!
- Spring is in the air and we have been exploring the signs of spring and seasonal change. We have been on a spring walk, have explored how Christians celebrated new life at Easter and painted beautiful daffodils.
- In mathematics we have been investigating the composition of numbers to 10, how to make doubles, forming patterns and sorting based on a variety of properties. We know that a double is a number sentences where the two 'parts' are equal.







# Year 1

#### This Half-term:



- In Maths, we have been learning about height, weight, volume and mass. We learnt through practical based activities such as seeing how far we could jump helped Tiny the Turtle experiments.
- In History, we have learnt about Neil Armstrong and the significance of his achievements. We have lots of future astronauts in Year 1!
- This term in Computing, we have learnt about algorithms and used Bee-Bots to programme our own.



• In Science, we have learnt about animals including humans. We know the various animal families, their diets and how we can look after our own pets at home.



# Year 2






### Our Children Say:

#### This Half-term:



- In our History topic, we have been learning all about Florence Nightingale and Mary Seacole but to kick off this topic we ran a teddy bear hospital to check up on some of our sick patients.
- Our latest Science topic is 'Animals including Humans' for this topic we have looked at different life cycles and worked in pairs to make our own life cycle chain for humans.

Class 5 performed a special class worship all about Saint Patrick. We told the story of Saint Patrick and we explained how he helped to spread the Christian faith throughout Ireland. We shared some songs and also performed an Irish dance. We had lots of fun and we think we deserve the golden buzzer.

Class 6 performed their class worship all about Lent and how it links to kindness. We read our lines beautifully and filled it with two lovely songs. Look out Hollywood, we're coming for you!




# Year 3







- "I liked taking photos of people's shoes and editing them. That was fun!"

## This Half-term:

- In Science, we have been learning about light and shadows. We have investigated light sources, reflections and shadows throughout the day. We also used data loggers to measure light intensity of different reflective surfaces.
- In Computing, we worked on altering digital media. Using iPads we took photographs. Then, we applied filters; cropped photos; changed backgrounds; and adjusted lighting and colour. We also discussed clues that help us identify altered images.
- In History, we have been learning all about Ancient Egypt. Some of the aspects we have looked at include: irrigation systems, the Nile river, Discovery of the Rosetta Stone and hieroglyphics.We also visited Manchester Museum and participated in a workshop led by a real Egyptologist!
- This half term, in Writing, we wrote an informative article to persuade the reader to protect blue whales.



# Year 4



## Our children say:

#### This Half-term:



- In Maths, we have been learning about length and perimeter. We have also done lots of work on fractions. We now know how to convert improper fractions to mixed numbers and we are beginning to add fractions.
- In Geography, we have been learning about Nigran. We have practiced map skills like using a scale bar, longitude, latitude and compass points. We have also compared Didsbury to Nigran - we think we know where we want to live!
- This term in computing, we have learnt how to make an iMovie! Our creations were awesome!
- In Science, we have learnt about sound. We have done lots of science experiments to explore pitch and volume.
- In religion, we have learning about selfdiscipline and how to practice this at home and at school.
- We really enjoyed our craft afternoon making wind chimes - thanks to everyone who came!

- We have continued our Space themed fun in Writing, where we have created some wonderful fact-based reports!
- Class 11 performed a very special Worship all about International Happiness Day. We all read our lines beautifully, created and performed an amazing rap and song. Well done Class 11!
- At Easter Crafts, we created some Easter themed decorations including a cross, Easter bunny or Easter egg. We used our stitching skills to sew two pieces of felt together and add details they were beautiful and we loved sharing this time with our families!


# Sports


Their musical scores have now been submitted and we are waiting to receive a video message from Omar, the composer for the ENO to see if he hopefully enjoyed their 'Creations!'
