Summary of Findings

- 73 parents completed the survey in July 2025.
- 100% of parents who completed the survey agreed their child is happy at St. Catherine's.
- 97.3% of parents who completed the survey stated that their child feels safe at St. Catherine's.
- 97.3% of parents who completed the survey agree pupils at St. Catherine's are well-behaved.
- 100% of parents who completed the survey agree their child is well looked after at St. Catherine's.
- 98.6% of parents who complete the survey agree their child is taught well at St. Catherine's.
- 100% of parents who have a child with SEND, agree that St. Catherine's gives their child the support they need to achieve.














What year group is your child currently in?











My child feels safe at St. Catherine's













To us knowing that our daughter is happy and safe is the most important thing in the world.


The kind caring staff. know that my child is cared for in school at all times. Especially ir times of difficulty.



They grow up fast and all we have are the school books at the end of the year.

The parent craft sessions etc... can be tricky for working parents!

In a term it can be difficult for parents to get to a worship, sports day, craft event etc... it is lovely. But it is also difficult to attend and then you child feels let down by parent if they can't get to it.

The opportunity to see your child's books during the year on an early evening is also lovely and very rewarding for the child.
