Reading for Pleasure



Reading Books

The books that your child brings home will be in line with our phonics programme (Sounds-Write)

Within the books are different activities. We would like to recommend the following for your child's daily reading at home

Reading books are changed on a Friday.

Home Reading – The Process

Monday	Check your child knows the target sounds in the book by e.g. showing them individual sounds or asking them to decode and read the words at the back of the book.
Tuesday	Read the book together, keeping it fun and lively. Maybe reading a page each. Talk about what is happening in the story.
Wednesday	Ask your child to re-read the book, aim for an increase in pace and fluency. Maybe they could experiment with changing their voice for the characters. Discuss whether they like the story, can they relate to it etc.
Thursday	Play the game at the back of the book/practise reading or spelling the words listed.
Friday	Return the book to school ready for a new book to be issued.

Economic Wellbeing -Continuous Provision Make a collection of different purses and wallets filled with coins for the children to play with. They can take on different roles within the café or shop to develop an understanding of using

and handling money.
