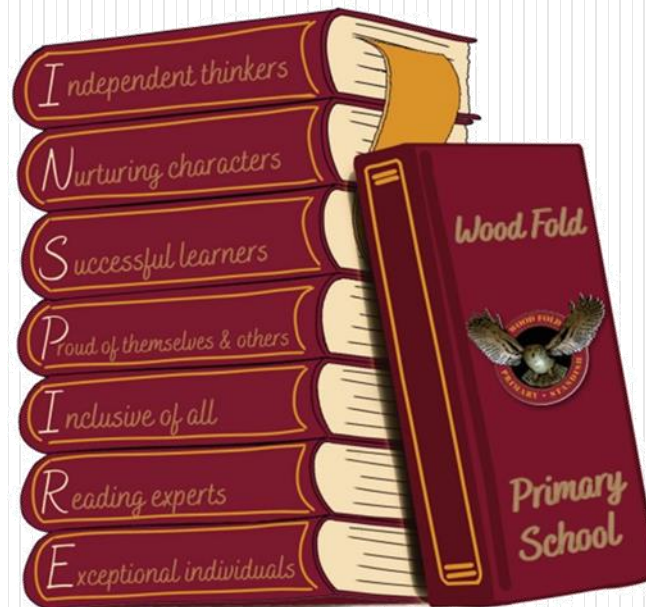

During our time in Year 4, we will go on educational trips, explore our school grounds and have inspirational visitors which will support the learning and development of the children.

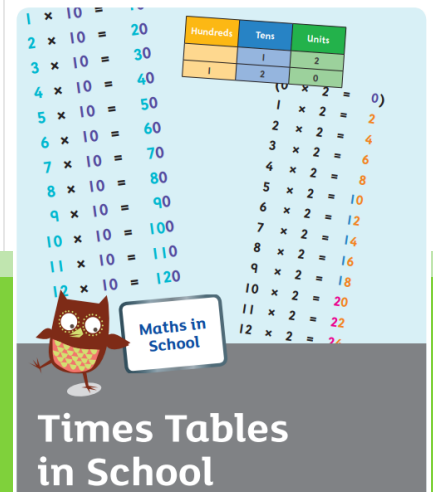

Times Tables



In Year 4, we will be learning and revising all of the multiplication and division facts, both in and out of order up to 12×12 .

Y2- 2s, 5s, 10s Y3: 3s, 4s and 8s, Y4: 11s, 6s, 9s, 12s, 7s

In Year 4, children will partake in an annual check of their times tables knowledge. The Year 4 Multiplication Tables Check is a statutory online quiz with 25 questions; children must answer each question within a 6 seconds time limit so the whole test will take less than 5 minutes.

This takes place in June 2026

Addition:

Y4

Add numbers with up to 4 digits.

Continue to use the compact column method, adding ones first and carrying underneath the calculation. Also include money and measures contexts.

Year 4 Maths Strategies

Multiplication:

Y4

Multiply 2 and 3 digits by a single digit using all multiplication tables up to 12×12 .

Short multiplication

24×6 becomes

$$\begin{array}{r} 24 \\ \times 6 \\ \hline 144 \\ \hline \end{array}$$

Answer: 144

342×7 becomes

$$\begin{array}{r} 342 \\ \times 7 \\ \hline 2394 \\ \hline \end{array}$$

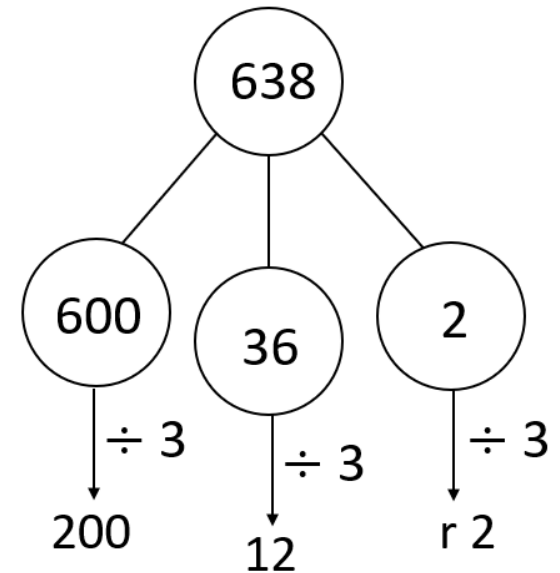
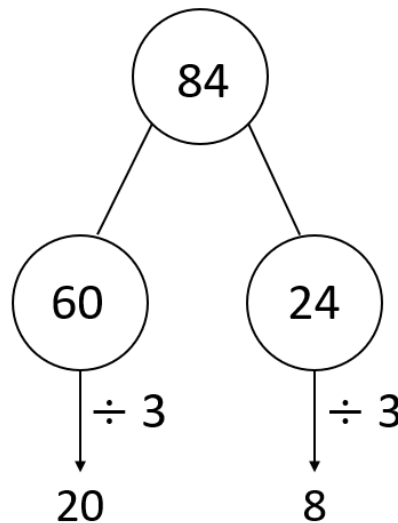

Year 4 Maths Strategies

Division:

We use our multiplication knowledge to flexibly partition the number into numbers that are easily divisible by the divisor. We divide each part, then add the answers together.
