
## Trips and Visitors

In Year 4, we will be learning and revising all of the multiplication and division facts, both in and out of order up to  $12 \times 12$ .

Y2- 2s,5s,10s Y3: 3s, 4s and 8s, Y4: 11s, 6s, 9s, 12s, 7s

In Year 4, children will partake in an annual check of their times tables knowledge. The Year 4 Multiplication Tables Check is a statutory online quiz with 25 questions; children must answer each question within a 6 seconds time limit so the whole test will take less than 5 minutes. This takes place in June 2026






