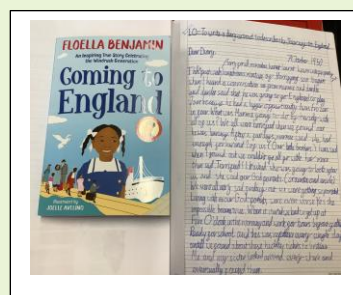
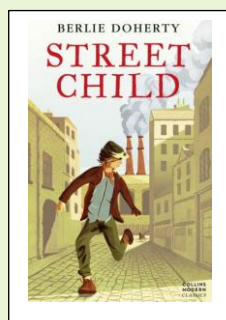


## Maths Work
