The children approached these with confidence and resilience and we are very proud of their efforts. Alongside this, it has been a joy to welcome the first group of children for our new EYFS induction sessions. These are always such a special milestone and it has been lovely to begin building relationships with the newest members of our school family. There have also been some very special moments of worship and reflection. Year 1 took part in their Baptism Service at church, which was a beautiful and memorable occasion and Year 5 led a thoughtful and engaging class worship. Across school, learning has extended well beyond the classroom. Six of our children represented us superbly at a Reception mini skills event, demonstrating great teamwork and enthusiasm.
