English - Narratives

Write a short story ($\frac{1}{2}$ -1 page) that teaches a moral or life lesson (e.g., kindness, honesty). Write a poem (at least 8 lines) about a time you felt proud or overcame a challenge. Use at least one simile or metaphor.

DT - Instruments

Build a simple shaker or drum using recycled materials at home. Decorate it with African patterns.

PSHE - Belonging

Interview a family member about a group or community they belong to. Write 3-5 sentences about what makes that group special.

Science - Space

Make a fact sheet or model about the planets in our solar system. Include one fun fact and one important feature for each planet.
