Science - States of Matter

Look in your kitchen and find 3 solids, 3 liquids and 3 gases. Draw them or take photos and label each one.

Challenge: Explain what happens if one of them is heated or cooled.

Label the shapes used.

Geography - Where Food Travels From

Pick one food from your home and draw a map showing its journey from farm to your plate.
