

## **Key Instant Recall Facts Year Three – Spring 1**

## I know the multiplication and division facts for the 8 times table.

By the end of this half term, children should know the following facts. The aim is

for them to recall these facts instantly.

$8 \times 1 = 8$	$1 \times 8 = 8$	8 ÷ 8 = 1	8 ÷ 1 = 8
$8 \times 2 = 16$	$2 \times 8 = 16$	$16 \div 8 = 2$	$16 \div 2 = 8$
$8 \times 3 = 24$	$3 \times 8 = 24$	$24 \div 8 = 3$	$24 \div 3 = 8$
$8 \times 4 = 32$	$4 \times 8 = 32$	$32 \div 8 = 4$	$32 \div 4 = 8$
$8 \times 5 = 40$	$5 \times 8 = 40$	$40 \div 8 = 5$	$40 \div 5 = 8$
$8 \times 6 = 48$	$6 \times 8 = 48$	$48 \div 8 = 6$	$48 \div 6 = 8$
$8 \times 7 = 56$	$7 \times 8 = 56$	$56 \div 8 = 7$	$56 \div 7 = 8$
$8 \times 8 = 64$	$8 \times 8 = 64$	$64 \div 8 = 8$	$64 \div 8 = 8$
$8 \times 9 = 72$	$9 \times 8 = 72$	$72 \div 8 = 9$	$72 \div 9 = 8$
$8 \times 10 = 80$	$10 \times 8 = 80$	80 ÷ 8 = 10	80 ÷ 10 = 8
$8 \times 11 = 88$	$11 \times 8 = 88$	88 ÷ 8 = 11	88 ÷ 11 = 8
$8 \times 12 = 96$	$12 \times 8 = 96$	$96 \div 8 = 12$	$96 \div 12 = 8$

Key Vocabulary
What is 8 multiplied by
6?

What is 8 times 8?

What is 24 **divided** by 8?

They should be able to answer these questions in any order, including missing number questions e.g.  $8 \times 9 = 32$  or  $9 \times 9 = 32$ 

## Top Tips:

The secret to success is practising **little** and **often**. Use time wisely. Can you practise these KIRFs while walking to school or during a car journey? You don't need to practise them all at once: perhaps you could have a fact of the day.

<u>Use what you already know -</u> Your child will already know many of these facts from the 2, 4, 5 and 10 times tables.

<u>Double your fours</u> – Multiplying a number by 8 is the same as multiplying by 4 and then doubling the answer.  $4 \times 3 = 12$  and double 12 is 24, so  $8 \times 3 = 24$ .
