Your donations and presence at the fayre are greatly appreciated both by students and the staff.










KEEPING YOUR CHILD SAFE ONLINE...





Students are increasingly relying on WhatsApp and other social media apps to stay connected, but it's important for them to understand the safety risks that come with using these platforms.

While these apps make communication quick and convenient, they can also expose students to issues such as cyberbullying, scams, fake accounts, and the pressure to share personal information.

Messages and images can be easily forwarded or screenshotted, meaning private content may not stay private. Students should be encouraged to use strong privacy settings, think carefully before posting or sharing anything, and **speak to a trusted adult** if they encounter something worrying online.

Developing good digital habits now will **help keep them safe** and responsible as they navigate the online world.

- *WhatsApp widely used for chat and group messaging.
- *Telegram another popular messaging app with channels and groups.
- *Discord often used for group chats and communities (especially for games or clubs).
- *Signal focused on privacy and secure messaging.
- *Snapchat messaging with photos and short videos shared among friends.


