You can choose how you present your work but please have a go at one of the following:

- Draw a picture of your whole family (including pets!) and label it.
- Make a mini photo album from baby to now, what have you learned to do since then?
 - Find a place to stand; it could be in your house, garden or somewhere else. What can you hear, see, smell, taste and touch?
- Ask a grown up about your family tree. Can you draw it or find photos labelling each member of your family?
- Draw, collage or paint a self-portrait & describe yourself, e.g. blonds, shiny hair.
- Find a photo of you. All around it write down the things that are special about you, e.g. I can count. I can run fast, I am caring.
- Decorate cardboard cutouts of people to look like your family members. Use fabric, sequins, wool etc to create clothing and features. Can they recognise themselves?
- Ask you parents or grandparents if they have any photos of themselves as babies or children. Can you tell it's them? What differences do you notice in the furniture, clothing or hairstyles?

- Especially over the holidays, please encourage your child to read as often as possible, listening to them whenever you can, as well as reading to them.
- Specified days for activities such as PE library book changing will be given out in September.
- Encourage them to use their sounds to read or spot words they come across over the holidays.
- Ask your children to help you count around the house, e.g. can you
 fetch me three slices of bread, can you count out how many t-shirts
 are hanging on the washing line?

- Reinforce our learning in Numeracy this term with addition and subtraction stories e.g. "We had 10 apples yesterday but we ate 3, how many are left?" "You have 7 crayons on the table, if you got 4 more how many would you have?"

- See if they can remember their 2D/3D shape learning, what shape is my slice of toast, a tomato etc.
