

Applying for a Primary school place

You must apply for a primary school place a year before your child can start school. The school starting age is 4.

Your child will be 3 or have just turned 4 when you apply.

Applications open in September each year and close on 15 January 2026.

Applying for a Secondary school place

Applications usually open on 1 September 2025. You must apply for a secondary school place by 31 October 2025

Your child is less likely to be offered a place at their chosen schools if you miss the deadline for applications.

How to get your code

- Visit ChildcareChoices.gov.uk to check your eligibility.
- 2 Speak to your provider to understand their arrangements and to see if they can offer your child a place.
- 3 Apply for your code online.
 You'll need your National
 Insurance number (or
 unique taxpayer reference if
 self-employed), the date you
 started or are due to start work,
 details of any government
 support or benefits you receive,
 and your child's UK birth
 certificate reference number
 (if available).
- 4 Give your code to your provider. You may find out if you're eligible straight away, but it can take up to 7 days to get your code.
- 5 Reconfirm your details on your childcare account every 3 months.

Application deadlines

To get your 30 hours childcare code, apply by:

- 31 August 2025 to use it from 1 September 2025.
- 31 December 2025 to use it from 1 January 2026.
- 31 March 2026 to use it from 1 April 2026.

You can find out using the eligibility checker on our website. Simply scan the QR code or search 'Childcare Choices'.

Using your childcare hours

- If you meet the criteria, you can start using your hours the term after your child reaches the right age. Terms start on 1 January, 1 April, and 1 September.
- Check or update your details every 3 months to keep getting your childcare hours. Don't worry, you'll get a reminder when it's time.
- You can use your hours alongside other schemes like Tax-Free Childcare or Universal Credit Childcare. You can mix and match between nurseries, childminders and pre-schools.
- You may be asked to pay for certain optional additional services on top of your entitlement hours, although these must not be a condition of accessing your governmentfunded place. Speak to your provider for more information.
- Different providers might have their own rules for using childcare hours. Check that their hours work for you.

Forest Pre-School & Nursery

"We've had a fantastic week of learning and discovery as part of our Black History Month celebrations! The children have been truly inspired while exploring the achievements of remarkable individuals who have made lasting contributions to the world. This week, we focused on three significant figures: Garrett Morgan – Inventor of the traffic light and a pioneer in safety innovations. Alfred Cralle – The mind behind the ice cream scoop, making serving treats quicker and easier! Mae Jemison – The first Black woman to travel to space, who showed us that the sky is not the limit. The children engaged in lively discussions, creative activities, and role play activities. Please take a moment to ask your child about what they've learned."

Action

Reception

The children have been making repeating patterns this week. They have used colour, objects and natural materials to do this. We have talked about what patterns we can see throughout the day. In the discovery area we pulled up all the carrots, tomatoes and sweetcorn we planted last year. The children really enjoyed the carrots, describing them as 'sweet, juicy and delicious!'.

Action

Please make sure book bags, reading records and books come back daily so they we can change these as and when we need to. PE day is Friday so please only send your child in trainers on this day. Thank you.



Year 1

This week in Maths, we have been looking at part, part, whole models. Where the children have given a whole number for example 7 and look at what two number can make up the parts. For example; 2 is a part. 5 is a part. The whole is 7.We have also taken a stroll through the deep dark woods. We have learnt to retell the story of the Gruffalo through drama and the children have been able to use this to plan their own innovated story. Please ask your child to see if they can retell their story to you."

Action

Please remember to sign your child's reading planner and practise there spellings through the week.

Year 2

This week in Religious Education we have been learning about the Muslim Holy book the Qur'an. We discussed how the Qur'an was revealed t Prophet Muhammad (PBUH) and why it is special to Muslims. 2A also presented their amazing parent worship explaining all about the Jewish festival Sukkot. We are extremely proud of all their hard work.

Please continue to read with your child at least three times a week and complete the set homework for maths.



Year 3

This week we have been working on our core strength in PE using plyometrics. We have continued to learn about ancient civilisations in history and compared French phonics to English phonics in our languages lesson. In maths we have begun a new unit about addition and subtraction and in science we have planned a healthy balanced meal.

We have been focussing on our mental health and taking time to do activities for our wellbeing.

Action

Please read at home with your child 3 times each week. It will support your child's reading fluency if they read their book more than once. You should record each read in their planners which will usually be checked on Wednesdays.

Year 4

Year 4 have had a brilliant week this week! In Maths we have been learning different ways to subtract with exchange. In English we have been reading 'The trapper.' The children enjoyed making push switches for their topic in science this week!

Action

Please ensure children are reading regularly at home.



Year 5

This week, Year 5 have started to look at the complexities of multiplication and division. We have also started to create our own non-fiction book all about weather. Soon we will be starting our national bulb project which will last all year.

Action

Listen out for any news on the bulb project and how you can help.

Year 6

"We've had a busy and productive time in class recently! The children have now completed the first drafts of their flashback stories and have been working hard on editing them in preparation for writing their final versions. Editing is such an important skill — we're encouraging the children to take ownership of their writing by spotting their own mistakes and looking for ways to uplevel their sentences, vocabulary, and structure. In Maths, we've been exploring division in depth. We've covered short division, long division using factors, and the drop-down method. The children have been developing their understanding of when and how to apply each method and building confidence in solving more complex problems."

Action

Homework is due every Wednesday. Please encourage your child to read regularly at home and practice their times tables. Make sure your child arrives on time and is wearing the correct school uniform each day. Thank you for your continued support!
