Applying for a Primary school place

You must apply for a primary school place a year before your child can start school. The school starting age is 4.

https://www.gov.uk/apply-for-primary-school-place

Your child will be 3 or have just turned 4 when you apply.

Applications open in September each year and close on 15 January 2026.

Applying for a Secondary school place

Applications usually open on 1 September 2025. You must apply for a secondary school place by 31 October 2025

Your child is less likely to be offered a place at their chosen schools if you miss the deadline for applications.

Councils will send offers of school places for:

Primary schools on 16 April 2026 Secondary schools on 1 March 2026

Have you validated all your working family codes?

The code start date must be before 31st August 2025 to be eligible for the term

A child CANNOT take up a new place in a Grace period

If a child attended your provision last term and have entered their grace period they will be funded for the Autumn Term and MUST reconfirm before 31st December to be eligible for Spring

If you would like any codes validating by the team - please send through the parental eligibility Validation form, these children will be added to your headcount for you

How to get your code

- Visit ChildcareChoices.gov.uk to check your eligibility.
- 2 Speak to your provider to understand their arrangements and to see if they can offer your child a place.
- 3 Apply for your code online.
 You'll need your National
 Insurance number (or
 unique taxpayer reference if
 self-employed), the date you
 started or are due to start work,
 details of any government
 support or benefits you receive,
 and your child's UK birth
 certificate reference number
 (if available).
- 4 Give your code to your provider. You may find out if you're eligible straight away, but it can take up to 7 days to get your code.
- 5 Reconfirm your details on your childcare account every 3 months.

Application deadlines

To get your 30 hours childcare code, apply by:

- 31 August 2025 to use it from 1 September 2025.
- 31 December 2025 to use it from 1 January 2026.
- 31 March 2026 to use it from 1 April 2026.

You can find out using the eligibility checker on our website. Simply scan the QR code or search 'Childcare Choices'.

Using your childcare hours

- If you meet the criteria, you can start using your hours the term after your child reaches the right age. Terms start on 1 January, 1 April, and 1 September.
- Check or update your details every 3 months to keep getting your childcare hours. Don't worry, you'll get a reminder when it's time.
- You can use your hours alongside other schemes like Tax-Free Childcare or Universal Credit Childcare. You can mix and match between nurseries, childminders and pre-schools.
- You may be asked to pay for certain optional additional services on top of your entitlement hours, although these must not be a condition of accessing your governmentfunded place. Speak to your provider for more information.
- Different providers might have their own rules for using childcare hours. Check that their hours work for you.

Reception

Year 1

"This week, to have explored the seasonal changes. We have discussed the 4 seasons and we have used our observations to say which season we currently in. What observations can you make at home? Next week, Friday 24th, we are going to the Art Museum in Blackburn. We will be walking there, weather permitting, so please ensure the children have a suitable coat and foot wear. We will be going in the morning and we will be back after lunch. We have looked at different textile art/artists and we want to explore other types of art to inspire our creatively. If you have any questions please let a member of Year 1 team know."

Year 2

This week the children have enjoyed our story 'The Gruffalo'. They have drawn characters, settings and even made the Gruffalo out of play doh! They used clues scattered outside to go on a scavenger hunt and find the characters. During the discovery area session we pulled up all the tomatoes and sunflowers and picked out all the seeds ready to plant in Spring.

Action

Next Tuesday and Thursday evening is parents evening and we look forward to seeing you all then. We hope all the children that have been poorly this week are starting to feel better ready for the last week of term.



Year 3

This week we have been working on our core strength in PE using plyometrics. We have continued to learn about ancient civilisations in history and compared French phonics to English phonics in our languages lesson. In maths we have begun a new unit about addition and subtraction and in science we have planned a healthy balanced meal.

We have been focussing on our mental health and taking time to do activities for our wellbeing.

Please read at home with your child 3 times each week. It will support your child's reading fluency if they read their book more than once. You should record each read in their planners which will usually be checked on Wednesdays.

Year 4

Year 4 have had a brilliant week this week. In English we have been writing a newspaper report and in Maths we have started a new topic called 'Area.' The children enjoyed testing different materials to test if they are conductors or insulators in Science.

Action

Please ensure children are reading at home.



Year 5

This week, Year 5 have started to look at the complexities of multiplication and division. We have also started to create our own non-fiction book all about weather. Soon we will be starting our national bulb project which will last all year.

Action

Listen out for any news on the bulb project and how you can help.

Year 6

"Year 6 have been working hard to complete their learning on long division. They have learned to divide multi-digit numbers by one-and two-digit numbers, work with remainders. The children have practiced following a clear step-by-step method: fact box, divide, multiply, subtract, and repeat. Year 6 have recently started reading Heroes by David Long, a powerful non-fiction book that shares extraordinary true stories of real-life bravery. Each chapter introduces a different hero, who has shown remarkable courage in the face of danger or adversity. Through this text, pupils are exploring how factual information can be presented in an engaging and inspiring way."

All homework should be completed and returned by Wednesday. Thank you for supporting your child with their home learning.
