



RENEW YOUR CODE!

Please remember to renew any free childcare codes by signing into your childcare choices account and reconfirming your details to ensure your child remains eligible for their free early years education entitlement. Statutory guidance requires all parents to reconfirm their entitlement for each term. We cannot accept codes that have not been reconfirmed and approved by BwD. For further information please visit

How to get your code

- Visit ChildcareChoices.gov.uk to check your eligibility.
- 2 Speak to your provider to understand their arrangements and to see if they can offer your child a place.
- 3 Apply for your code online.
 You'll need your National
 Insurance number (or
 unique taxpayer reference if
 self-employed), the date you
 started or are due to start work,
 details of any government
 support or benefits you receive,
 and your child's UK birth
 certificate reference number
 (if available).
- 4 Give your code to your provider. You may find out if you're eligible straight away, but it can take up to 7 days to get your code.
- 5 Reconfirm your details on your childcare account every 3 months.

Application deadlines

To get your 30 hours childcare code, apply by:

- 31 August 2025 to use it from 1 September 2025.
- 31 December 2025 to use it from 1 January 2026.
- 31 March 2026 to use it from 1 April 2026.

You can find out using the eligibility checker on our website. Simply scan the QR code or search 'Childcare Choices'.

Using your childcare hours

- If you meet the criteria, you can start using your hours the term after your child reaches the right age. Terms start on 1 January, 1 April, and 1 September.
- Check or update your details every 3 months to keep getting your childcare hours. Don't worry, you'll get a reminder when it's time.
- You can use your hours alongside other schemes like Tax-Free Childcare or Universal Credit Childcare. You can mix and match between nurseries, childminders and pre-schools.
- You may be asked to pay for certain optional additional services on top of your entitlement hours, although these must not be a condition of accessing your governmentfunded place. Speak to your provider for more information.
- Different providers might have their own rules for using childcare hours. Check that their hours work for you.

Applying for a Primary school place

You must apply for a primary school place a year before your child can start school. The school starting age is 4.


Your child will be 3 or have just turned 4 when you apply.

Year 3

Year 6

Welcome Back to School Year 6! We're delighted to welcome the children back for another exciting term of learning!

In Maths, the children are learning about equivalent fractions. They're discovering how different fractions can represent the same value and are practising their skills using practical activities and visual models.

In English, the children are exploring poetry. We are studying the famous poem "In Flanders Fields" by John McCrae, learning about its meaning, imagery, and historical context as we approach Remembrance Day. The children will also have the chance to write their own thoughtful poems inspired by themes of remembrance and peace.
