

You must apply for a primary school place a year before your child can start school. The school starting age is 4.


Your child will be 3 or have just turned 4 when you apply.

Applications open in September each year and close on 15 January 2026.

RENEW YOUR CODE!

Please remember to renew any free childcare codes by signing into your childcare choices account and reconfirming your details to ensure your child remains eligible for their free early years education entitlement. How to get your code

- Visit ChildcareChoices.gov.uk to check your eligibility.
- 2 Speak to your provider to understand their arrangements and to see if they can offer your child a place.
- 3 Apply for your code online.
 You'll need your National
 Insurance number (or
 unique taxpayer reference if
 self-employed), the date you
 started or are due to start work,
 details of any government
 support or benefits you receive,
 and your child's UK birth
 certificate reference number
 (if available).
- 4 Give your code to your provider. You may find out if you're eligible straight away, but it can take up to 7 days to get your code.
- 5 Reconfirm your details on your childcare account every 3 months.

Application deadlines

To get your 30 hours childcare code, apply by:

- 31 August 2025 to use it from 1 September 2025.
- 31 December 2025 to use it from 1 January 2026.
- 31 March 2026 to use it from 1 April 2026.

You can find out using the eligibility checker on our website. Simply scan the QR code or search 'Childcare Choices'.

Using your childcare hours

- If you meet the criteria, you can start using your hours the term after your child reaches the right age. Terms start on 1 January, 1 April, and 1 September.
- Check or update your details every 3 months to keep getting your childcare hours. Don't worry, you'll get a reminder when it's time.
- You can use your hours alongside other schemes like Tax-Free Childcare or Universal Credit Childcare. You can mix and match between nurseries, childminders and pre-schools.
- You may be asked to pay for certain optional additional services on top of your entitlement hours, although these must not be a condition of accessing your governmentfunded place. Speak to your provider for more information.
- Different providers might have their own rules for using childcare hours. Check that their hours work for you.

Year 2

"This week in English, we have been writing our own innovated versions of The True Story of the Three Little Pigs. The children came up with some fantastic ideas and have really enjoyed putting their own twist on the story. You might like to ask your child to retell their innovated story at home – they can even add actions to make it extra fun!In Maths, we have been learning about the properties of 2D shapes and exploring vertical symmetry. The children have been busy identifying symmetrical shapes and creating their own symmetrical patterns. This afternoon, the Fire Safety Team will be visiting school to talk to the pupils about how to stay safe in the event of a fire. The children will learn important safety tips and have the opportunity to ask questions"

Year 3

Year 6

"We have had a very productive and enjoyable week in class! In Maths, the children have been focusing on multiplying and dividing fractions. They have shown great perseverance as they tackled new methods and applied their understanding to a range of problem-solving activities. It has been wonderful to see their confidence grow as they recognise connections between different fraction operations and work more independently. In Reading, we have completed our STAR assessments, and the children have now received their new ZPD scores. These updated ranges will help guide their reading choices and ensure they continue to make steady progress. We encourage children to explore a variety of texts within their ZPD to develop both fluency and comprehension skills. A highlight of our week has certainly been the pantomime preparations. The performance is really starting to come together, and the children have been full of enthusiasm during our afternoon rehearsals. The singing and dancing have brought lots of laughter and energy into the classroom, and it's been lovely to see everyone participating with such excitement and teamwork.
