We are increasingly getting requests from parents requesting information about their children. We are always happy to provide this, but please note



RENEW YOUR CODE!

Please remember to renew any free childcare codes by signing into your childcare choices account and reconfirming your details to ensure your child remains eligible for their free early years education entitlement. Statutory guidance requires all parents to reconfirm their entitlement for each term. We cannot accept codes that have not been reconfirmed and approved by BwD. For further information please visit

How to get your code

- 1 Visit [ChildcareChoices.gov.uk](https://www.ViewChildcareChoices.gov.uk) to check your eligibility.
- 2 Speak to your provider to understand their arrangements and to see if they can offer your child a place.
- 3 Apply for your code online. You'll need your National Insurance number (or unique taxpayer reference if self-employed), the date you started or are due to start work, details of any government support or benefits you receive, and your child's UK birth certificate reference number (if available).
- 4 Give your code to your provider. You may find out if you're eligible straight away, but it can take up to 7 days to get your code.
- 5 Reconfirm your details on your childcare account every 3 months.

Application deadlines

To get your 30 hours childcare code, apply by:

- **31 August 2025** to use it from 1 September 2025.
- **31 December 2025** to use it from 1 January 2026.
- **31 March 2026** to use it from 1 April 2026.

You can find out using the eligibility checker on our website. Simply scan the QR code or search 'Childcare Choices'.

Using your childcare hours

- If you meet the criteria, you can **start using your hours the term after your child reaches the right age**. Terms start on 1 January, 1 April, and 1 September.
- **Check or update your details every 3 months** to keep getting your childcare hours. Don't worry, you'll get a reminder when it's time.
- **You can use your hours alongside other schemes** like Tax-Free Childcare or Universal Credit Childcare. You can mix and match between nurseries, childminders and pre-schools.
- **You may be asked to pay for certain optional additional services on top of your entitlement hours**, although these must not be a condition of accessing your government-funded place. Speak to your provider for more information.
- **Different providers might have their own rules** for using childcare hours. Check that their hours work for you.

Forest Pre-School & Nursery

Reception

"The children have been looking at feelings this week. They have made colour monsters and have spoken about their feelings and the feelings of others. In maths we have looked at mass and capacity, exploring how much a container can hold and how heavy and light objects are. The children enjoyed the discovery area this week, looking for signs of winter and jumping in muddy puddles! We will be continuing to explore space next week.

Year Group Updates

Year 1

This week we have been learning about Egypt. We have located it on a map and looked at the different continents. We have discussed whether Egypt is hot or cold and looked at evidence to explain our answers.

Action

"Please can you ensure you sign the children's diaries once they have read their books.

Year 2

"We have had another busy week in Year 2! The children started their Science unit all about 'Plants'. At home this weekend, can the children spot any seeds in the fruits or vegetables they eat? We have had fun starting to learn different balances in Gymnastics. We can't wait to see their creativity shine."

Action

PE will be on Wednesdays and Thursdays. Our unit for this term is gymnastics. Please could you ensure that your child is wearing the appropriate PE kit and that any jewellery has been removed for these sessions. Also, please could your child wear socks on these days as these will need to be removed for PE. Reading books will be given out next week when the children have settled into their new reading groups. Thank you for your support.





Year Group Updates

Year 3

This week in maths, the children have been developing their skills in finding the difference, using subtraction, counting on, and number lines to compare numbers confidently and explain their thinking. In reading, we have been enjoying the non-chronological report 'Butler-Bot' and have been using our VIPER skills, with a focus on Vocabulary to explore the meaning of new and interesting words from the story, and Prediction to make thoughtful guesses about what might happen next. The children have shown great enthusiasm this week, well done!

Action

"Please read at home at least 3 times per week. Thank you.

Year 4

Year 4 have had a brilliant week. In English we have been finishing reading 'A journey to Jo'burg and in Maths we have been multiplying a 2 digit number by a 1 digit number. In Science we have been looking at the different type of teeth we have and their functions.

Action

Please ensure children are reading their books and their diaries are being signed at least 3 times a week.



Year Group Updates

Year 5

"The children this week have read further in "Boy in the Tower" by Polly Ho-Yen. They have explored themes around mental health and created help sheets for those who need help with identifying and supporting people with mental health. The children have started to explore Multiplication of fractions.

Action

Continue to independently learn on Century Tech. Especially subjects taught so they are not forgetting.

Year 6

"Year 6 pupils have completed their mock tests in Maths and English, helping them become familiar with test conditions and giving teachers insight into their progress. They are also enjoying gymnastics in PE, developing strength, balance, and coordination. To ensure all children can fully participate in PE lessons, please make sure they are wearing the correct PE kit."

Action

"Children are encouraged to continue practicing the skills they have learned using Century Tech at home, which supports their learning and builds confidence across subjects. Parents are kindly asked to check that their child has completed their Century Tech homework."
