

# PENALTY NOTICE FINES

If your child misses school without authorisation you may be issued a fine



## FIRST OFFENCE

If a parent receives a penalty notice for a child, they will need to pay **£160 (within 28 days)**. However, the fee is reduced to £80 if paid within 21 days of the notice.

## SECOND OFFENCE

If a parent receives a second penalty notice for the same child within three years, it will cost a flat fee of **£160 if paid within 28 days**. There's no option to pay a lower amount.

## THIRD/ FURTHER OFFENCES

A parent cannot get a third penalty notice for the same child within three years of the first one. If the parent reaches the limit again within those three years, other actions will be taken instead, like **legal steps or other attendance interventions**.







### RENEW YOUR CODE!

Please remember to renew any free childcare codes by signing into your childcare choices account and reconfirming your details to ensure your child remains eligible for their free early years education entitlement. Statutory guidance requires all parents to reconfirm their entitlement for each term. We cannot accept codes that have not been reconfirmed and approved by BwD. For further information please visit

## How to get your code

- 1 Visit [ChildcareChoices.gov.uk](https://www.ViewChildcareChoices.gov.uk) to check your eligibility.
- 2 Speak to your provider to understand their arrangements and to see if they can offer your child a place.
- 3 Apply for your code online. You'll need your National Insurance number (or unique taxpayer reference if self-employed), the date you started or are due to start work, details of any government support or benefits you receive, and your child's UK birth certificate reference number (if available).
- 4 Give your code to your provider. You may find out if you're eligible straight away, but it can take up to 7 days to get your code.
- 5 Reconfirm your details on your childcare account every 3 months.

## Application deadlines

To get your 30 hours childcare code, apply by:

- **31 August 2025** to use it from 1 September 2025.
- **31 December 2025** to use it from 1 January 2026.
- **31 March 2026** to use it from 1 April 2026.



## See what support you could get

You can find out using the eligibility checker on our website. Simply scan the QR code or search 'Childcare Choices'.

## Using your childcare hours

- If you meet the criteria, you can **start using your hours the term after your child reaches the right age**. Terms start on 1 January, 1 April, and 1 September.
- **Check or update your details every 3 months** to keep getting your childcare hours. Don't worry, you'll get a reminder when it's time.
- **You can use your hours alongside other schemes** like Tax-Free Childcare or Universal Credit Childcare. You can mix and match between nurseries, childminders and pre-schools.
- **You may be asked to pay for certain optional additional services on top of your entitlement hours**, although these must not be a condition of accessing your government-funded place. Speak to your provider for more information.
- **Different providers might have their own rules** for using childcare hours. Check that their hours work for you.

# Year Group Updates

## Forest Pre-School & Nursery

"This week, our nursery children have been busy drawing hens, developing their mark-making skills. Mark making is an important part of early writing in the EYFS, helping children build hand strength, coordination, and confidence as they begin to share their ideas through drawings and early writing. We have also introduced a new writing area in the nursery to encourage children to explore writing independently. Alongside this, we are promoting writing in all areas of learning, giving children lots of meaningful opportunities to make marks, draw, and write as part of their play."

### Action

Parents' Evening will take place next Tuesday and Thursday.

## Reception

This week in Drawing Club we read the text 'The Little Red Hen'. The children enjoyed using masks and acting this out. In the discovery we discussed why items may be stuck in the ice, how they got there and the different states of matter. The children are enjoying our PE unit of gymnastics, ask them to show you the different jumps they have learnt!

### Action

# Year Group Updates

## Year 1

As part of Year 1 funding raising we are looking at running 'Pancake mornings'. If you would like your child to have a pancake please speak to a member of the Year 1 team.

## Action

Please ensure you sign the children's diary once they have read their books.

## Year 2

This week the children have started to complete an experiment in Science to observe if seeds can grow without soil. We are doing this by completing the Hydroponics Farm Method. We also went down to KS2 to visit the Book Fair. The children were all very excited to see the range of wonderful books and stationary.

## Action

"We look forward to welcoming you to Parents Evening on Tuesday and Thursday next week. Please continue to read with your child and ensure Reading Records have been signed. "





# Year Group Updates

## Year 3

"In maths, the children have been developing their understanding of sharing and grouping. They've been using practical resources and drawings to help them divide amounts equally and spot groups within numbers. Our English lessons have been full of magic! The children have been exploring poetry inspired by wizards and potions. They've enjoyed playing with descriptive language, powerful adjectives and alliteration to create their own spellbinding poems. "

## Action

"Please practise your 3x tables at home. QR codes for Hit the Button are on the back page of homework books."

## Year 4

Year 4 have had a brilliant week this week. In English we have been analysing parts of Journey to Jo'burg. In Maths we have been learning how to calculate the perimeter of a shape. The children particularly enjoyed investigating which toothpaste is the best at removing stains in Science this week.

## Action

Please ensure children are reading regularly at home. Planners should be signed at least 3 times a week.



# Year Group Updates

## Year 5

"This week, the children have been exploring newspapers. They have looked at the features and read examples before attempting to write their own. They will continue this next week.

## Action

Please check if you have a parents evening booked with your teacher. If not, please contact the office

## Year 6

"This week in Maths, we have begun learning about area and perimeter. The children have discussed the different formulas and the importance of remembering both the formulas and the key differences between area and perimeter. As part of this unit, we will also be exploring a range of shapes. In English, we have been researching spotted lizards from the novel Holes. The children will be using their research to write a non-chronological report. We have focused on understanding the importance of purpose and audience when writing information texts."

## Action

"Please continue to encourage your child to use Maths Bots to practise their arithmetic and improve their score. If your child gets any questions wrong, please ask them to write these in their planner and show them to their teacher so we can discuss them and address any misconceptions. It is also very important that your child reads regularly. We encourage children to talk about their book with an adult and look up any unfamiliar words to help develop their understanding and vocabulary. This will make all the difference to their progress. We thank you for your continued support."
