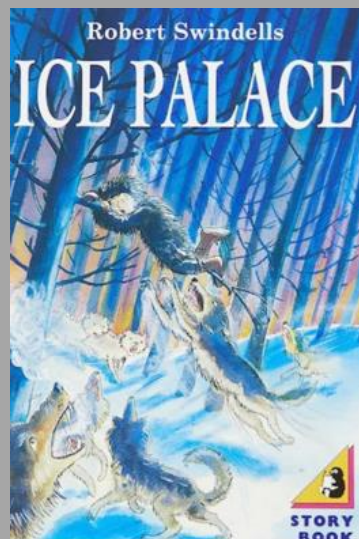
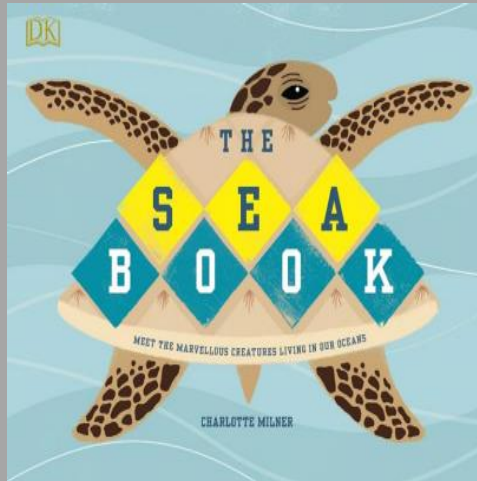
Reading in Year 3

Children will take part in whole class reading, every day, from 9:30-10:00.

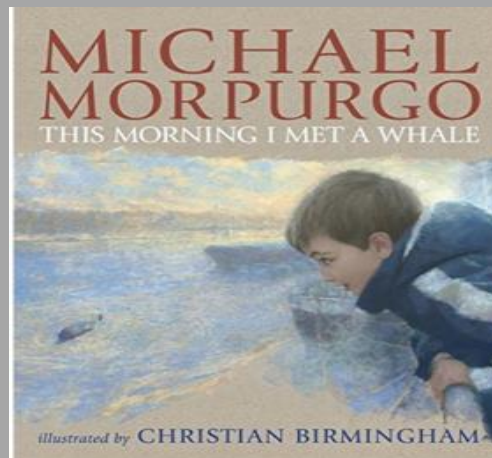
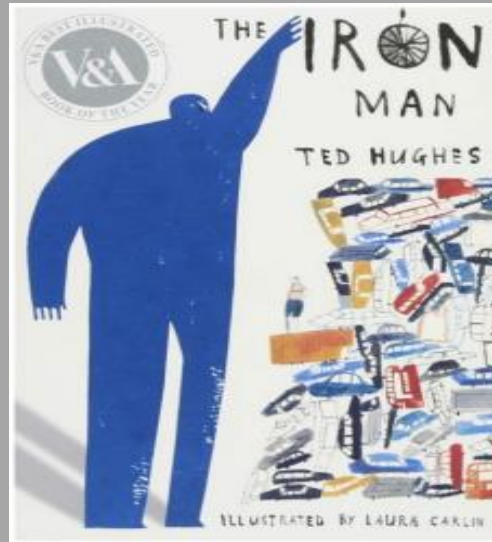
Reading development

- **Children will develop their inference skills (how to read between the lines, using evidence from the text).**
- **Develop their understanding of higher level vocabulary as well as dictionary skills and how this creates imagery for the reader.**
- **How to summarise main points within a text as well as make detailed predictions using ideas from previous reading.**
- **How to rapidly retrieve information from the text and use evidence to back up their ideas.**

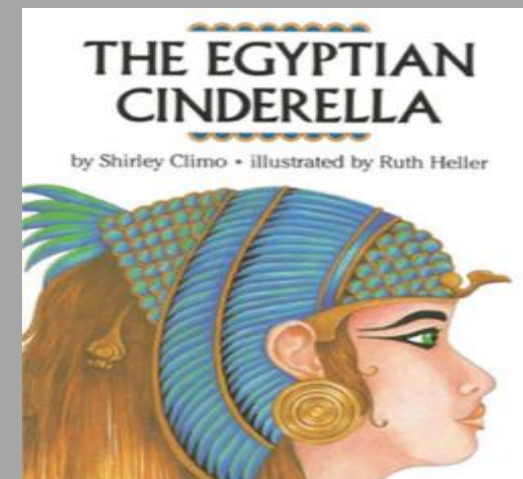

Children will have 1 hour of English lessons, every day, which include a range of spelling, grammar, punctuation and other written and oral tasks.

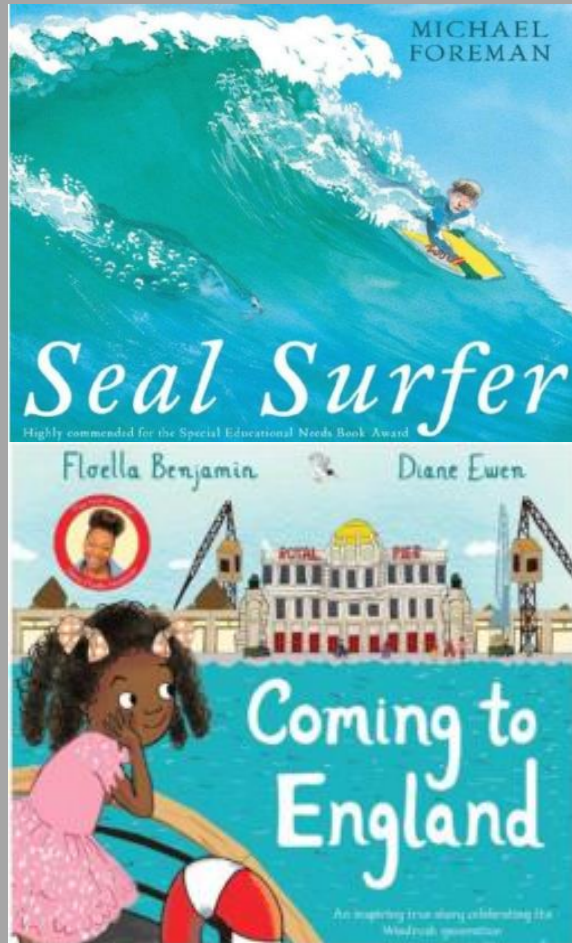
Writing Development

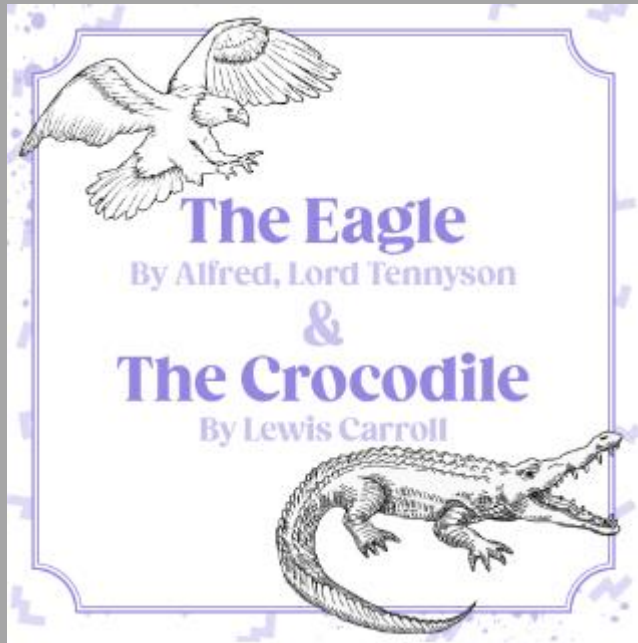

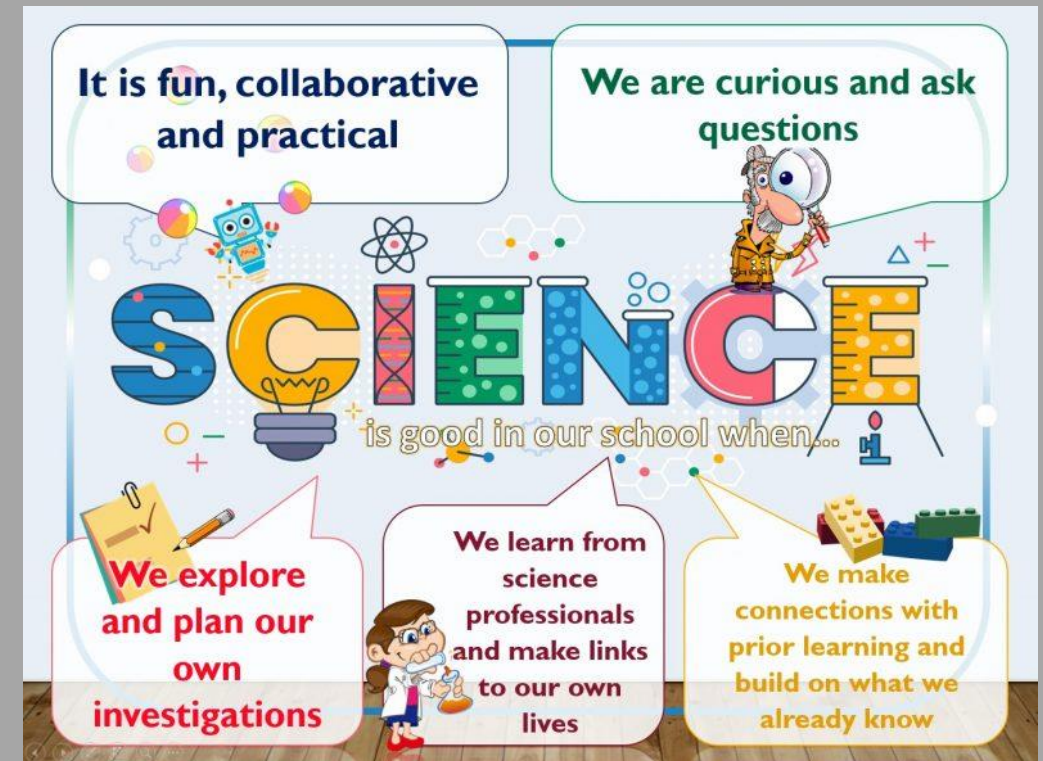

Creative Arts in Year 3

Creative arts are extremely important at Hale and we encourage children to be confident, creative and artistic in all aspects of their learning.

ART

Children will explore a range of artists and produce work that reflects that particular artist and their techniques. Children will have sketchbooks to develop their ideas and reflect on their learning.

DT

As with art, DT will take a similar approach, encouraging children to plan, design, make, create and evaluate their learning.

Children will have 1 music lesson per week linked to Charanga as well as additional music lessons led by music specialists across the academic year.
