<u>What will your child learn</u> <u>during Judaism week?</u>

Muslims are followers of the religion of Islam, which began in Saudi Arabia around the seventh century. They believe in one God, Allah. There are two main groups of Muslims; Shi'ah and Sunni. The Sunnis are the larger group. Their beliefs are similar but they differ on the forms of leadership. What the children learn in this programme of study is a middle way, offering what is most general in Islam.

Nursery and Reception

Special Days/Ritual Objects: Prayer Mats The children will learn that Muslims cherish special objects in their religion, such as prayer mats and the Qur'an.





Year 1 Stories: Muhammad The children will hear special stories about Muhammad – the final prophet of Islam.

Year 2 Prayer/Home: Prayer at Home

The children will learn and respect that prayer and quiet times are very important; Muslims pray five times a day.
