We hope you had a wonderful half term break and are ready for Autumn 2. We have a jam-packed half-term full of exciting learning experiences. Our learning will be based around Geography, with an enquiry question of 'What is it like here?'. During the term, we will learn about our local area, focusing from the large scale (England) to small scale (Sheffield, and Rivelin Primary). We will be using the fieldwork skills of observing, recording, and presenting data.

English

We will continue to develop our reading skills by beginning our reading practice sessions, using decodable books from 'Little Wandle'. These will happen three times a week, before the children take their book home to share with an adult.

In English we will be doing lots of amazing writing around the classic tale 'Little Red Riding Hood'. We will also learn how to write a fantastic recount of our walk to the Rivelin Valley!
