

Primary PE and Sport Premium Report

Academic Year: 2024–2025

Total Funding Allocation: £19,329

1. Amount of PE and Sport Premium Funding Received

For the academic year 2024–2025, the school received a total allocation of **£19,329** in Primary PE and Sport Premium funding.

This funding has been used to enhance the quality of physical education provision, increase opportunities for pupils to participate in physical activity and sport, and to support staff in delivering high-quality PE lessons.

2. Breakdown of How the Funding Was Spent

3. Impact of the Funding on Pupils' Participation and Attainment in PE and Sport

The funding has had a positive impact on pupils' participation in sport and physical activity across the school.

A wide range of **extra-curricular clubs** has been provided, ensuring pupils have opportunities to engage in sport beyond curriculum PE lessons. Participation levels have been high across year groups, demonstrating strong enthusiasm for sport and physical activity. The clubs have been accessible to all pupils and have supported increased participation from pupils who may not otherwise engage in organised sport.

Additional equipment and playground resources have enhanced opportunities for **active play during break and lunchtime**, encouraging pupils to remain physically active throughout the school day.

The school's partnership with **SUFC** has supported the delivery of high-quality PE sessions and has provided pupils with opportunities to experience a broader range of sports. This partnership has also helped to develop staff confidence in delivering PE lessons and ensuring activities are progressive and engaging.

Participation in **inter-school competitions and School Games events** has increased pupils' opportunities to represent the school and develop teamwork, resilience and sportsmanship. These events have helped to raise the profile of sport within the school and encourage pupils to take pride in their achievements.

The impact of the funding is also evident in the increased confidence and participation of pupils with **Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND)**. Adapted activities and inclusive opportunities have ensured that all pupils are able to access and enjoy physical activity.

The school remains committed to promoting **equal opportunities for all pupils**, ensuring that both boys and girls participate fully in sports activities. The provision has also supported participation from both **Pupil Premium and non-Pupil Premium pupils**, ensuring equitable access to clubs, competitions and resources.

Pupil voice gathered through surveys and discussions indicates that pupils highly value the additional sporting opportunities available to them. Many pupils report that these activities have increased their enjoyment of physical activity and that they would like these opportunities to continue.

4. Sustainability and Next Steps

The school is committed to sustaining and building upon the improvements made through the use of PE and Sport Premium funding.

Future funding will continue to focus on:

- **Developing staff expertise** through ongoing professional development and coaching support.
- Continuing to build upon the **PE scheme of work and resources** currently used in school to ensure lessons remain engaging and progressive.

- Maintaining a strong programme of **extra-curricular activities and inter-school competitions**.
- Further enhancing opportunities for **inclusive sport**, ensuring that all pupils, including those with SEND, are able to participate fully in physical activity.

By continuing to invest in staff development and high-quality resources, the school aims to ensure that improvements in PE provision remain sustainable and continue to benefit pupils in future years.

5. Swimming and Water Safety

The school provides swimming lessons to ensure that pupils develop the skills required to meet the National Curriculum expectations for swimming and water safety.

For the current Year 6 cohort:

- **65%** of pupils can **swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres**.
- **65%** of pupils can **use a range of strokes effectively**, including front crawl, backstroke and breaststroke.
- **96%** of pupils can **perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations**.

Swimming continues to be an important part of the school's PE curriculum and provision will continue to be reviewed to further increase the number of pupils achieving these expectations.
