CELEBRATION OF THE WORD- PEACE

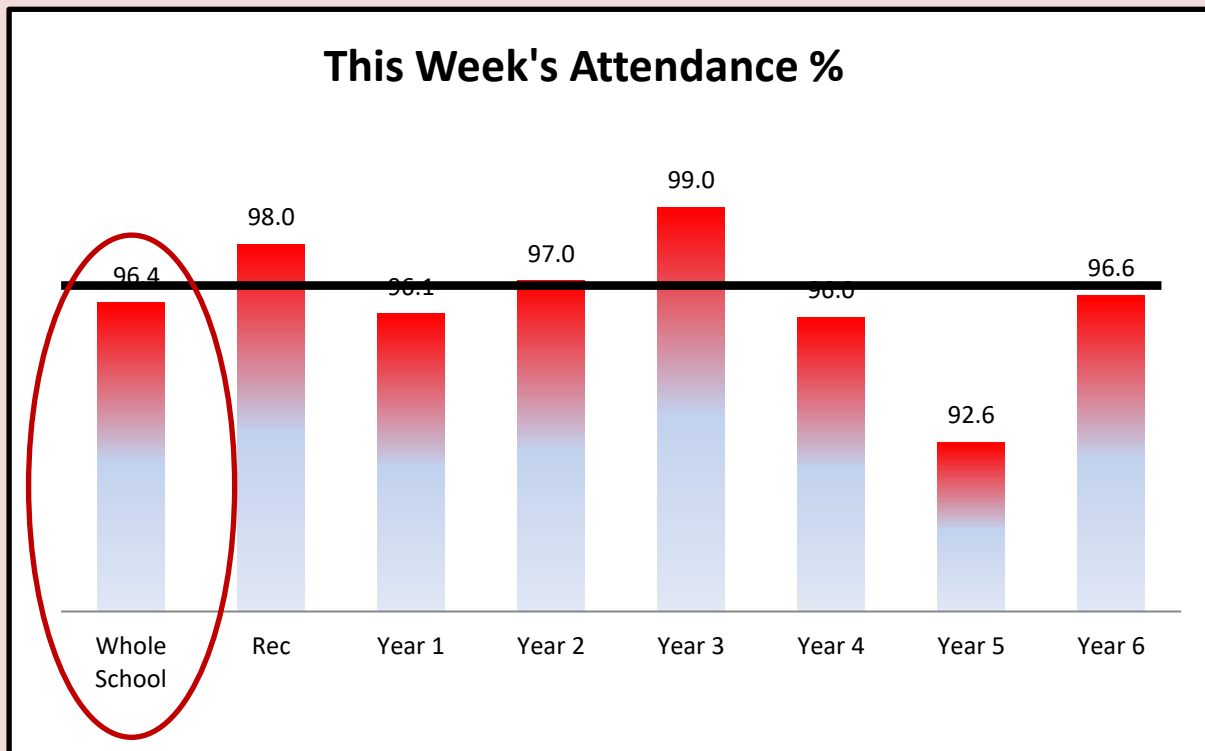
