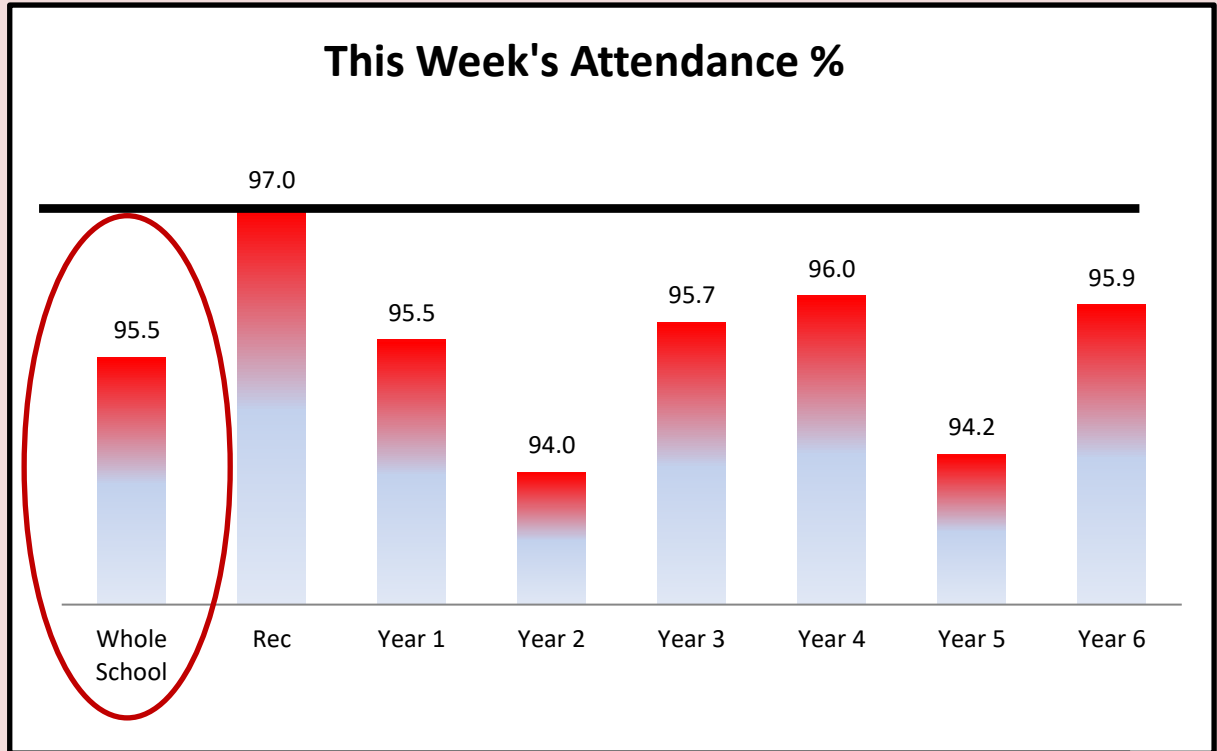
PARKING
