SEPTEMBER SCHOOL UNIFORM

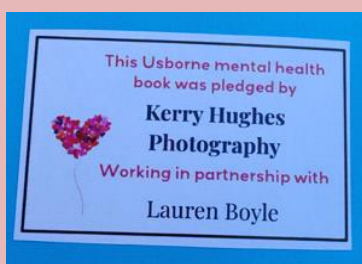
When we return to school in September, we revert to the winter uniform. This can be found on the school website under the main 'PARENTS' tab – UNIFORM.

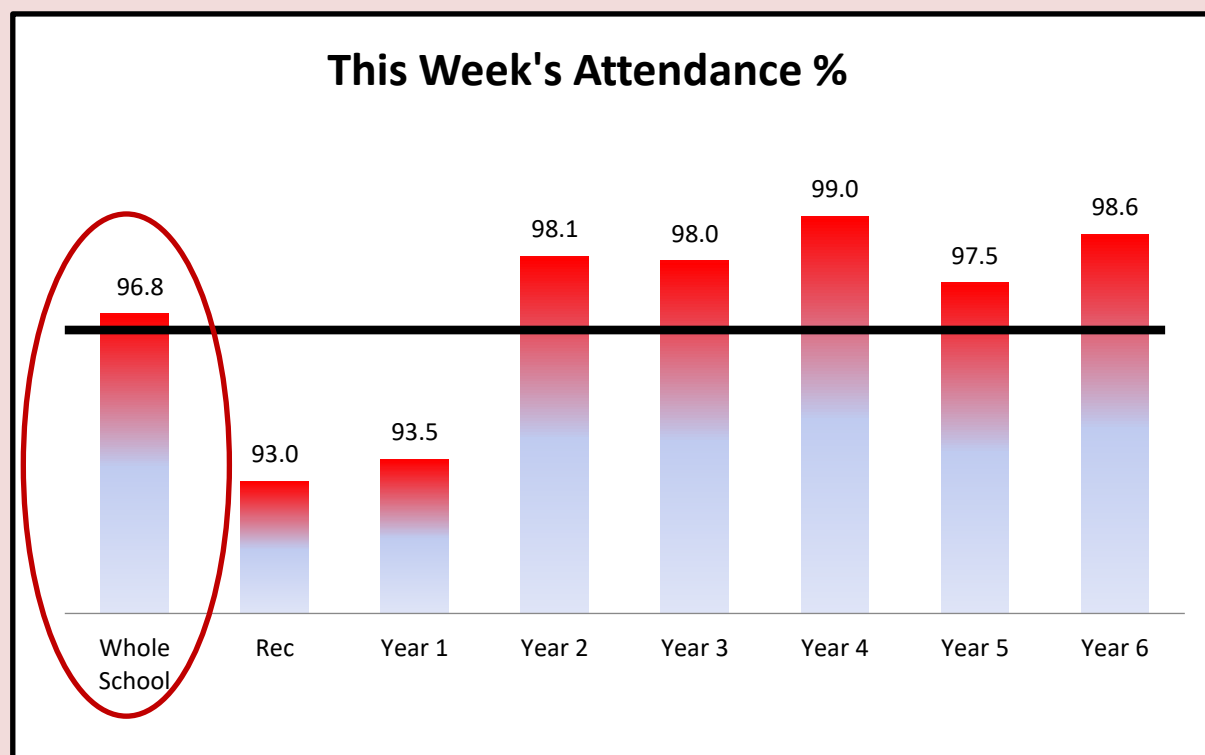
